- I was officially elected as the Mayor of Robe uncontested in the Supplementary Election on Friday 27 January 2023
- Cr Brown has been elected as Deputy Mayor
- Our Advisory Groups and Audit & Risk Management Committee are now up and running with some excellent representatives
- 500 runners participated in the Robe Run (I'm in training for next year's so look out!)
- I attended the LCLGA AGM and Board Meeting

Looking to the future, I am excited to let you all know that we have scheduled the dates for our Ratepayer Public meetings which are an opportunity for you to be briefed on the Robe 2050 Plan and provide feedback.

The CEO and I will be heading to Horsham and Adelaide to touch base with our non-resident ratepayers in addition to running sessions with our 'hamlets' (Bray, Nora Creina, etc) before finishing up with a session in the Institute for our 'in-town' ratepayers and any others who want to join.

The Robe Institute session will be live streamed on our council facebook page to ensure we can reach as many people as possible. Each session will cover the same content and is for the same purpose. The dates of the sessions have been included meeting dates section of this newsletter and they will be regularly posted on facebook to remind you all.

Director of Infrastructure Report

Olive Tree Maintenance

The Limestone Coast Landscape Board are targeting feral olive control and encouraging maintenance in the Robe and Kingston area.

Feral olives are highly invasive to native vegetation, degrade habitat for native wildlife and the oil-rich trees burn with great intensity creating significant bushfire hazards.

Unpicked olive fruit can be spread by animals and the resulting seedlings are extremely invasive.

Landscape Officers will be engaging landholders in the Robe and Kingston area to encourage the harvest of olive fruit or removal of unwanted trees.

Under the Landscape South Australia Act 2019, feral olives are declared for control and any olives planted for domestic, public amenity or commercial purposes must be maintained.

Landholders can help prevent the spread of domestic olives by ensuring trees do not fruit either by pruning ornamental trees before seed set, by ensuring all fruit is harvested from productive trees or removing entire trees and replacing with native habitat.

Senior Landscape Officer for the Limestone Coast Landscape Board, David Hinchliffe, says there has been an increasing trend to plant ornamental olive trees in gardens in the Robe and Kingston area.

“We are working directly with landholders in the area to encourage responsible olive tree maintenance including follow up control to treat seedlings and build awareness of the compliance requirements of owning an olive plant”, said Mr. Hinchliffe.”

Landholders are also encouraged to consider their choice when purchasing an olive tree given the maintenance required in their management and the alternative native plant options that offer similar aesthetic qualities and the added benefit of habitat for native wildlife.

Wild Rabbit Baiting

Baiting is an efficient way to control rabbit populations and reduce their impacts on agricultural production and native species.

Pindone is used for wild rabbit control in South Australia. The areas the Limestone Coast Landscape Board will be baiting is starting at West beach, Adam Lindsay Gordon Drive, along Joy Terrace up to the Robe Jetty - coastal side.

Pindone oat bait is dark green in colour which is found to be less attractive to the local birdlife.



Other areas that require baiting include the industrial estate, Evan Cave Road and the Cemetery.

Appropriate signage will be used. Pindone poison may be a safer poison option than 1080, however please keep domestic pets safe by having them on leashes in these areas.

The Limestone Coast Landscape Board's David Hinchliffe - Senior landscape Officer will begin the baiting program 2 March 2023 which will span one month.

South Australian Regional Bridge Upgrades

Culvert over Drain L, Princes Highway, Reedy Creek

Heavy Vehicle Access

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is upgrading a series of bridges and culverts across regional South Australia to extend the service life of the structures and improve safety for all road users.

As part of this program, the Department will be upgrading the culvert over Drain L located on Princes Highway, Reedy Creek (southeast of Kingston).

The project forms part of the \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade program, jointly funded (80:20) by the Australian and South Australian governments.

Works are scheduled to commence from **early March 2023, with project completion expected in mid-2023, weather permitting**. These works will be undertaken Monday to Saturday, between 7am and 5pm.

Works for the project will include site establishment, replacing the existing culvert, upgrading the safety barriers and vegetation management and removal where required.

To safely facilitate these works, both directions of travel will be via a temporary short diversion track adjacent to the Princes Highway. Speed restrictions will also be in place throughout the work area for the duration of the project. Please see map overleaf for details.

What to expect

Road users are asked to please plan ahead, expect delays, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible, with advance notice provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses, as much as practically possible.

Culvert over stormwater crossing, Princes Highway, Thornlea Heavy Vehicle access

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is upgrading a series of bridges and culverts across regional South Australia to extend the service life of the structures and improve safety for all road users.

As part of this program, the Department will be upgrading the culvert over the stormwater crossing located on Princes Highway, Thornlea (northwest of Millicent).

The project forms part of the \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade program, jointly funded (80:20) by the Australian and South Australian governments.

Works are scheduled to commence from late February 2023, with project completion expected in mid-2023, weather permitting. These works will be undertaken Monday to Saturday, between 7am and 5pm.

Works for the project will include site establishment, replacing the existing culvert and upgrading the safety barriers and vegetation management and removal where required.

To safely facilitate these works, traffic will be reduced to a single lane via a temporary short diversion track adjacent to Princes Highway, with temporary traffic signals in place to control the direction of traffic. Speed restrictions will also be in place throughout the work area for the duration of the project. Please see map overleaf for details.

What to expect

Road users are asked to please plan ahead, expect delays, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible, with advance notice provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses, as much as practically possible.

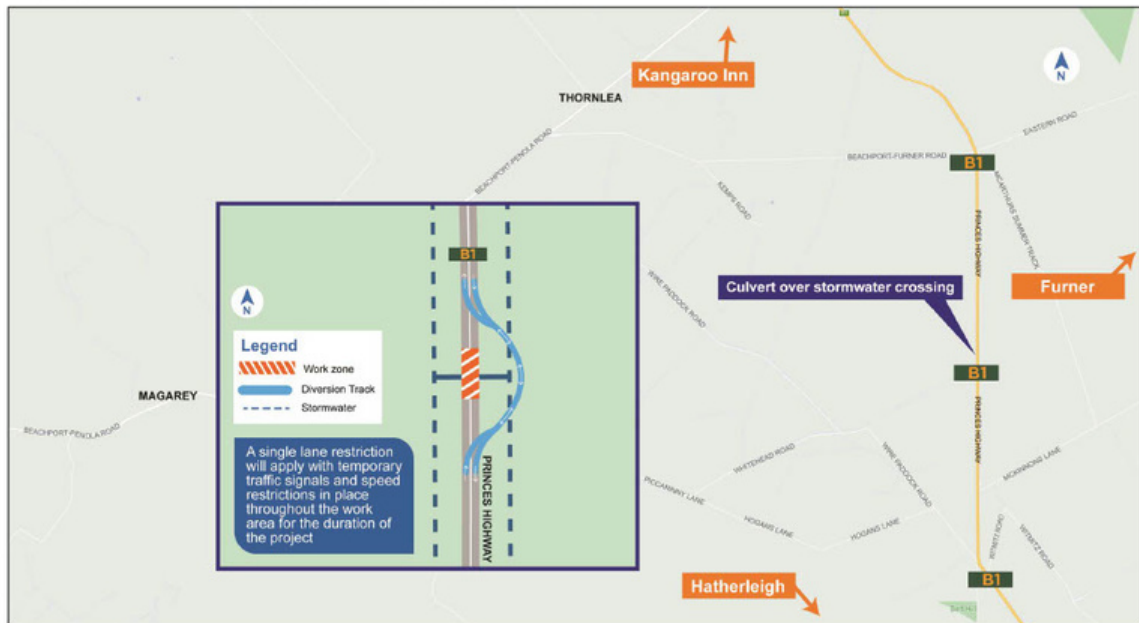

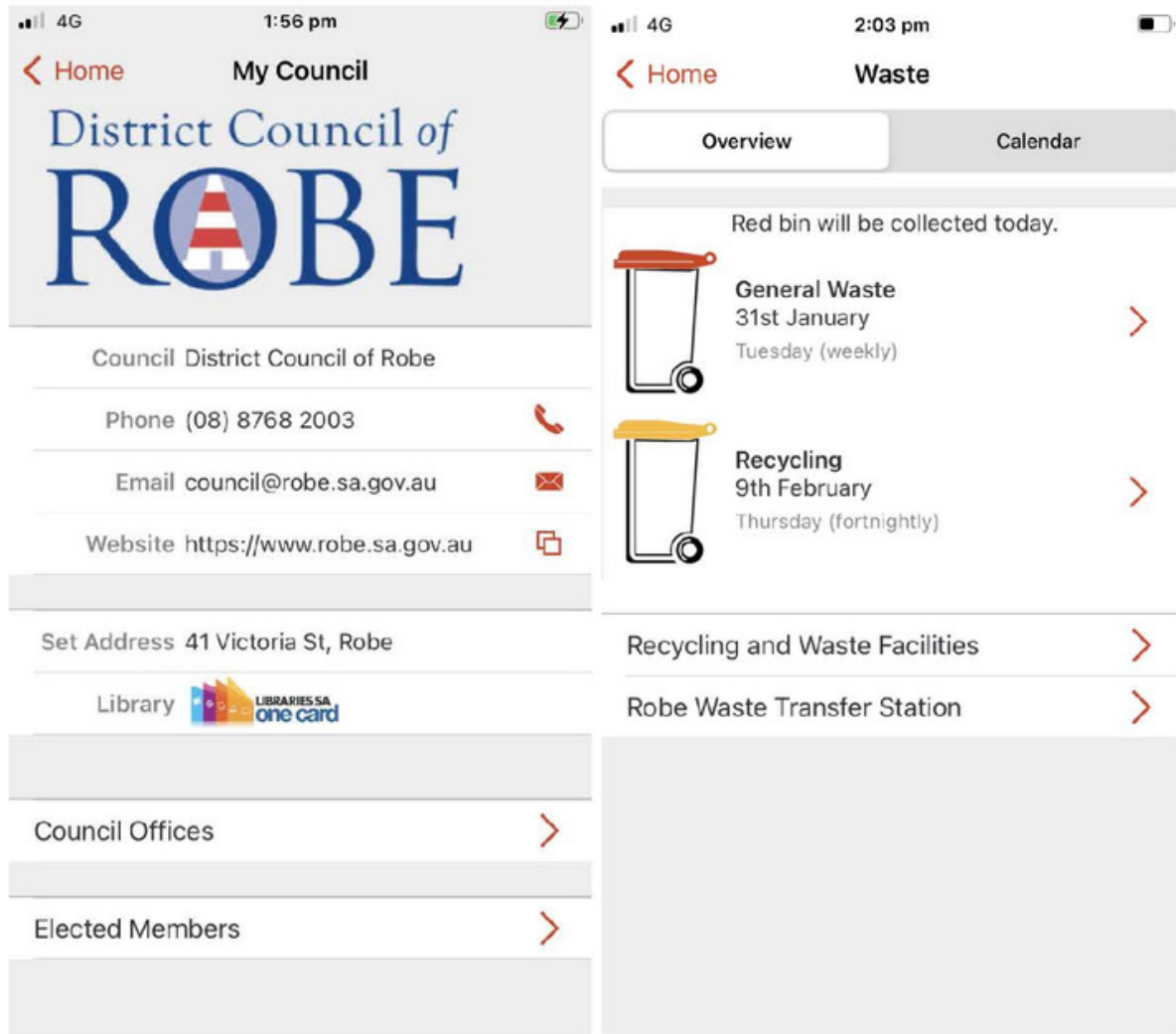

The My Local Services App is a smartphone application tailored especially for councils and their communities.

Informed by data and invaluable insights from the community via councils, the App has been designed to deliver localised council information to residents of South Australia.

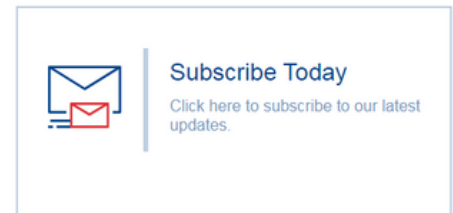

My Local Services is a mobile phone app that allows you to report a problem within the Council area, receive notifications about waste collection days and check Waste Transfer Station opening times. The app is designed to make it more convenient to find Council information 24/7.

You can also find places 'Near Me' such as parks and playgrounds.

We encourage all residents and ratepayers to download the App. It is very easy to use, and the details are specific to your house location. MyLocal Services App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to council@robe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.

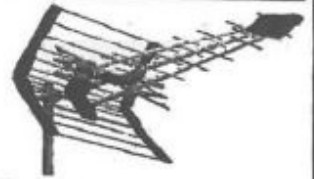

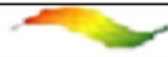
