Mayor's Report

Exciting news!! Veris and the District Council of Robe have won the Asia-Pacific Spatial Excellence Awards for South Australia Community Impact Award for the mapping of Robe's coastline. This is great recognition for this important piece of work that will be central in determining where and how fast our coastline is eroding. Congratulations to CEO James and the staff at Veris who lead this initiative.

There were approximately 65 people at the Institute meeting on 16 August regarding the land exchange proposal between the Robe Golf Club and the District Council of Robe. The information gathered from this meeting, along with the written submissions received by 22 August will be presented in a report to Council on 31 August. The consultation on the Robe Bowling Club lease and revised Community Land Management Plan has also closed and will be considered at the same meeting.

Council has conducted two Elected Member Briefing Sessions for people who are interested in nominating for Council in the upcoming elections. Five people attended which is a bit disappointing but I'm hoping there are others in the community considering nominating. You have until noon on 6 September to nominate and there are information packs online or limited hardcopies at Council if you are interested. Alternatively, you could call an Elected Member or the CEO to discuss what's involved.

All Councils go into what is called a caretaker period on 6 September. During this time, there are limitations on the type of decisions the current Council can make.

Along with all other Councils, we are working towards finalising some items and in our case, one of these is the contract for our CEO. The contract had to be dealt with prior to the caretaker period to avoid being in breach of his contract (which is a standard CEO contract). James has undergone a full independent review with input from some community members, current employees and the Elected Members.

At a meeting on 24 August, the Elected Members voted to renew James' contract for four years which we are pleased to say he has accepted. This provides ongoing stability for the community as we enter a period of change following the election.

There will be some new faces at Council too as the Manager of Corporate Services and Finance Kate Rayner has resigned from her position.

William Pavia, our Finance Officer, had his last day this month and he will be moving to Adelaide to be with his family.

Kate and William were a good team and the Elected Members thank them both for all of the effort they put into improving Council's processes and reports to ensure we were well informed for our meetings. We wish you and your families every success in the future.

And finally, it's early days, but there is the possibility of a small cruise ship calling into Robe in November. Things are not yet finalised, but fingers crossed it gets the go ahead.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

And the winner is ...

At the Asia-Pacific Spatial Excellence Awards (APSEA) for South Australia held in August, the 3D Monitoring of the Robe Coastline Project undertaken by Veris won the award for Community Impact.

The Veris team (see picture below) attended the APSEA-SA Dinner to accept the award and celebrate the outstanding work being undertaken in the geospatial field in SA.



On accepting the award, Veris thanked Chief Executive Officer James Holyman and the District Council of Robe, whom they worked closely with on this assignment. Council would also like to extend their congratulations to the Veris project team including Nicholas Davies, Giles Johnson, Dylan Gathercole, Michael Fazackerley and Elena Bruno-Scott for their amazing work on this award winning project.

The citation for the Award for Community Impact is:

"The District Council of Robe is strengthening its evidence-based approach to decision making to manage its popular coastline and provide a sustainable future for the local community. As part of its approach, the Council worked closely with Veris to perform LiDAR mapping of 48 hectares of coastline. A combination of aerial and mobile mapping technologies were deployed to provide an accurate spatial model of the coastline that will provide a foundational dataset to monitor changes along the coastline as a result of erosion and sea level rise, and better manage the risks associated with both public and private assets."

A case study and video have been published by Veris and these are also available on Council's website.

New Event for Robe

Council confirmed this month a new event for Robe – ROBE RUN!

This will be held on 11 February 2023 and is managed by the Adelaide Trail Runners. Council will assist with the event. Runners can enter to complete 5km, 11km, 21km or 42km run with a majority of courses taking advantage of Robe's beautiful coastline and coastal trail.

We will continue to keep the community informed through posts of Facebook and the Newsletter closer to the event.

Robe 2050 Survey

Please be advised that the Robe 2050 Survey has now closed and Dr Karen Miller is currently in the process of collating the data and preparing the report.

Council will be hosting a Robe 2050 Survey Public Information Session at the Robe Institute on 21 September 2022 at 6:30pm. The Information Session will be an opportunity for the community to be presented with the data and ask questions.

Throughout the survey period Council received 398 valid responses to the survey, with the majority being Robe resident responses.

In addition to the survey, Council also ran workshops with local builders and developers, a group of Under 35's, Robe Primary School and Kingston Community School students (reception, year six and year eleven)

The workshops were mainly targeted at hearing the option of our younger generations on how Robe should look and feel the year 2050. This was important as the focus for 2050 should be a town they want to live and work in. The responses were nothing short of brilliant, with a few of our personal favourites being: Zoo, Robe AFL Football Team, Women's Football Team, Lego Shop, Gingerbread Cookie Shop, Lolly Shop at Boatswain's Point, 10-pin bowling and Vet.

Council would like to thank all the people who took time and effort to make a submission to this important initiative for our community.

Praise for a Proactive Nora Creina Community

Council was impressed by the proactive initiative put in place by the Nora Creina Shackowners Association (NCSA) to improve safety at Nora Creina. The NCSA undertook a study to understand the volume of traffic travelling through the area. The community were aware of high traffic volumes during the holiday periods, particularly 4WD vehicles and that the drivers often ignored the posted 10kph speed limit (e.g., the fastest vehicle was logged at 52kph).

The NCSA used a Number Plate Recognition camera to capture all vehicle movements. The five month study recorded 21,676 plates travelling past the Number Plate Recognition camera. It has been estimated from the total number in the report that 18,000 (or 83 percent) were non-resident vehicles.

The current track into Nora Creina has two blind hillocks which represents an increasingly hazardous feature with many people ignoring the posted speed limit. Therefore, the NCSA are proposing to develop a recreational vehicle access point on Bog Lane from approximately 1.3 kilometres south of the crossroads to Nora Creina. A new track heading west along the current boundary of land owned by the Cullen family, continues across the coastal reserve to the beach.

It is important to understand that the cluster of approximately 64 leasehold holiday shacks at Nora Creina are on private property owned by the Cullen family. Council has provided public access to Nora Creina Beach outside the entry gates to the private property.

The NCSA see the benefits of a bypass as:

- Safety is improved by diversion of traffic directly onto Bog Lane via a well-designed T intersection on flat land with good sight lines.
- The growth in tourism will see an increase in traffic in the future and therefore an appropriately design bypass would reduce traffic volumes through the hamlet
- A reduction in dust and noise, and in the experience of visitors who just wish to make a day trip to the Nora Creina Bay.
- The proposal still allows the tourism experiences for 4WD vehicles to experience.

The Mayor, Chief Executive Officer and Director Infrastructure have met with Mr Russell Worland and Mr Neville Cullen to be briefed on the Study. The Study was also raised with the Mayor and Elected Members present when the District Tour was in Nora Creina.

The Director Infrastructure is considering options to have parking areas on Bog Lane to allow vehicle to let down or inflate tyres. This action will be considered when next updating our Four Year Business Plan.

Nominations for the 2022 Council Elections open on 23 August 2022 and close noon 6 September 2022. Nominations for the 2022 Councils Elections opened on Tuesday 23 August and close at noon, Tuesday 6 September. Please be aware that as the time frame is legislated, no late applications can be accepted.

Electronic nomination kits, including all documents required to become a candidate are available for download. Please check the Council Elections Website to download your electronic kit.

Tips for nominating:

- Familiarise yourself with the candidate checklist (page 1 of the Candidate handbook)

Contact details must not be a post office box number. Only electoral material can include a PO Box number for your own privacy

- Do not leave your nomination till the last minute! The portal will close at noon, 6 September and if you are half way through your nomination you will not be able to submit.
- Candidate profiles must not comment on decisions or actions of council past or present
- Must not refer to another person who has nominated in your candidate profile

Public Toilet Vandalism

The District Council of Robe have noticed an increase in vandalism to community assets. There has been vandalism within the public toilets around the town, including the Long Beach and Front Beach toilets. This ongoing issue is costing the community a lot of money as we have to pay to repair the damages done to these important community assets.

Please note that the police have been notified and they will be regularly patrolling the areas to help protect our assets. We need your help to try and find the culprits so we can put an end to the costly vandalism.

Sadly, our only alternative if the vandalism continues will be to close the public toilets to reduce the financial impact on the community of these unexpected repairs.



Office for Small and Family Business

Worker Accommodation

Council is aware that a lack of long-term rental availability for employees in Robe and many regions across the nation is impacting on economic growth. It is one of the key reasons that some of our local businesses has been closed or have significantly modified hours of operation. This particularly relates to affordable accommodation and having appropriate accommodation for seasonal workers. The subject of affordable worker accommodation is very complex.

As Council and the community work through the issues, we would like to appeal to people with houses on share accommodation platforms to consider converting them to long term rentals. This will assist in having employees to provide the services we expect when in Robe.

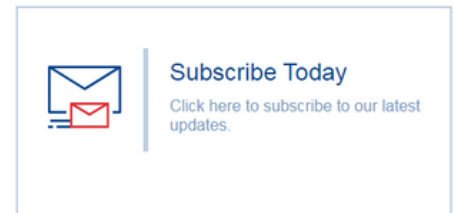

We encourage all residents and ratepayers to download the App. It is very easy to use, and the details are specific to your house location. MyLocal Services App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to council@robe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.
