Acknowledgement

It has been a very busy year for District Council of Robe, this year's Annual Business Plan and Budget has many major projects.

Many are now complete, some underway, some under tender and others are scheduled for next year.

The town is in advanced preparedness for the Summer influx and looking amazing. Thank you to all the staff at Council for your dedication.

I would also like to acknowledge the Elected Members for their dedication to a role that is not always easy.

2018 Election Year

Local Government elections will be held in November 2018. It is time to commence thinking and planning about who will be our community representatives for the next term of Local Government.

It is a very important time to communicate with Elected Members, talk to them about future intentions and talk among your community identifying future decision makers.

It is quite evident there are two types of ratepayers, those who are verbal and have opinions on most matters. The second group are often referred to as the silent majority, having confidence that the Elected members will make substantive decisions on their behalf.

It is important to recognise that the Elected Members are very dependent on contact and feedback from the community in fulfilling this function.

There are times when the silent majority need to have their say and the Elected Members need their feedback and support.

I would urge all in the community to make that effort on matters that they feel are important.

Telstra Tower

The Chief Executive and I have written to Telstra regarding re-evaluating the intended sighting of a 50 metre telecommunications tower adjacent the Southern Ports highway, Kingston Road section, on the outskirts of Robe. While a resolution has not been reached the dialogue is ongoing.

It is important to note Council understands that communication is seen as an essential service. Robe does have black spots and summer capacity issues. Council does appreciate Telstra work in this area but has major concerns about the locality of the intended tower.

From the Chief Executive

2017-2018 Capital Projects Update

Lake Butler Marina

The reconstruction of the Straddle Carrier Jetty has commenced and unfortunately this has not been completed by the 15th of December as was planned due to delays with the steel fabrication. It is anticipated that this will now occur early in January 2018. Council apologises to the fishing community for any inconvenience this may cause.

Robe Street Carpark

It is pleasing to note that this project has been completed except for some landscaping which will occur in 2018, involving paving and planting. The reconstruction of the carpark now provides for additional carpark spaces and removes the unsatisfactory surface which existed during the winter months.

Thank you to the community for their patience while this project has been undertaken.

Davenport Street

The final stage of the road construction, sealing the road, has been completed. Users of Davenport Street will note that the unofficial access at the Southern end of Davenport Street has been closed. This access was not on a public road but located on private property and while it may cause some inconvenience, Council cannot direct traffic through private property for many reasons, the least being it's not public land.

Construction of new Footpaths

The extension of the Lord Syleham and O'Halloran Street footpaths have been completed, as has the access to the Drain L Bridge upon the Main Road.

Robe Cemetery

Restoration of the Heritage Wall Robe cemetery

The contractor has commenced the reconstruction of the Heritage Wall at the Cemetery.

Construction of a niche wall at the cemetery

Plans are being prepared to allow a development application to be lodged for the construction of a new niche wall at the cemetery.

Memorial Wall

The western wing of the existing Niche Wall has been altered to allow for the placement of memorial plaques within the cemetery and the rear of the existing niche wall has been repaired and replastered.

Cemetery Structure Plan

A concept plan detailing how the cemetery will develop in the coming years and what services and facilities may be provided at the cemetery is being developed and will be placed before the community seeking your comments in the New Year.

Robe Main Beach New Access Ramp and Seawall Upgrade

Main Beach Robe is one of the most visited and utilised areas within our township with the beach providing a sea side experience for the many visitors to the town.

The beach is the venue for the annual learn to swim program and contains the two swimming pontoons which are very popular with the town's youth.

Access to the beach is currently via two concrete ramps, constructed in excess of 50 years ago which are not compliant with respect to providing abled and disabled access to the beach. These ramps at certain times of the year are also difficult for the general public to traverse due to their steepness and at times when the beach level drops leaving a significant drop off from the ramp to the sand.

The rock wall at the foreshore and the Bowling Club is deteriorating and exposing the public assets to damage from storm surge and high tides.

Council is commencing a three stage project to upgrade the beach access and repair and replace the sea wall. This project involves:

- Demolishing the two existing concrete ramps,
- The construction of a new ramp that complies with current disabled access regulations and will also be wide enough to accommodate plant and vehicles involved in sand replenishment on main beach.
- Reconstruction of the sea wall adjacent the new ramp, and
- Reconstruction of the sea wall adjacent the Bowling Club.

The construction of the new ramp and sea walls will be done in accordance with Coastal Protection Board guidelines and approvals.

It is planned to undertake the work in three stages with the first stage being the construction of the new access ramp and associated sea walls.

Foreshore fence

Council considered some alternative designs for the Foreshore fence at its meeting held in November and have put these designs before the community seeking the community's feedback. The proposed designs can be found on Council's website, under Latest News and are on display at the Council office. All feedback must be received by 5pm, Friday 23rd February 2018.

Council considered some alternative designs for the Foreshore fence at its meeting held in November and have put these designs before the community seeking the community's feedback.

The design options, including a pictorial representation, for the fence are listed on Councils website and can be viewed at the Council office.

A description of the options is detailed below:

Option 1

Replace top wooden rail with a small diameter galvanised iron pipe (1 ½ inch or 42 mm external).

Pros

Significantly reduces the impact of the top rail on the view.

Cons

Cost in removing existing rail and replacing top rail.
Galvanised iron pipe will rust in a marine environment.
The small diameter pipe will be easily bent out of shape by the public, requiring continual replacement.
The fence design is not in proportion nor is the use of different materials within the fence aesthetically pleasing.

Option 2

Replace top rail with large diameter galvanised iron pipe. (2 inch or 63 mm external – the same dimensions as the galvanised pipe and plastic post fencing council has used elsewhere within the town)

Pros

Significantly reduces the impact of the top rail on the view.
Larger diameter pipe will reduce opportunity for public to bend out of shape.
The top and bottom rail are more in proportion.

Cons

Cost in removing existing rail and replacing top rail.
Galvanised iron pipe will rust in a marine environment.
The fence design is not in proportion nor is the use of different materials within the fence aesthetically pleasing.

Option 3

Replace top rail with railway iron.

Pros

This significantly reduces the impact of the top rail on the view.
Railway iron is rigid thereby reducing the opportunity to for the rail to be bent out of shape.
Railway iron is already rusty and therefore will not appear as affected by the marine environment as would other ferrous materials.
The top and bottom rail are more in proportion.

Cons

Costs in replacing existing top rail.
The use of different materials within the fence is not aesthetically pleasing.

Option 4

Top rail replaced with aluminium rail.

Pros

The profile of an aluminium rail will significantly reduce the impact of the top rail on the view.

Rail is more rigid which will reduce opportunity for public to bend out of shape.
Not affected by the marine environment.
The top and bottom rail are more in proportion.

Cons

Costs in replacing existing top rail.
The use of different materials within the fence is not aesthetically pleasing.

Option 5

Retain existing wooden posts, remove top and bottom rails and replace rail with 1/12 inch galvanised iron pipe.

Pros

Significantly reduces the impact of the rails on the view.

Cons

Cost in removing top and bottom rail and replacing top rail with galvanised iron pipe.
Galvanised iron pipe will rust in a marine environment.
The small diameter pipe will be easily bent out of shape by the public, requiring continual replacement.

Note – this is an option (1) provided by Councils Heritage Advisor

Option 6

Retain existing wooden posts, remove top and bottom rails and replace rail with 1/12 inch galvanised iron pipe. Infill fence with 2 strands of stainless steel wire.

Pros

Significantly reduces the impact of the rails on the view.

Cons

Cost in removing top and bottom rail and replacing top rail with galvanised iron pipe and stainless steel wire.
Galvanised iron pipe and stainless steel wire will rust in a marine environment.
The small diameter pipe will be easily bent out of shape by the public, requiring continual replacement.
The wire will continually be stretched requiring annual maintenance.

Note – this is option 2 provided by Councils Heritage Advisor

Option 7

Reduce the dimensions of the top rail by a half or third using the exiting wooden rail.

Pros

Reduces the visual impact of the rail.
Reduces costs by using existing material.
Not affected by the marine environment.
Complies with Councils development plan for the Heritage precinct of the town.

Cons

Cost involved in removing and amending the rail dimensions.
The top and bottom rails are not in proportion.

Option 8

Retain existing wooden post and rail fence.

Pros

Rail is more rigid which will reduce opportunity for public to bend out of shape.
Not affected by the marine environment.
The top and bottom rail are in proportion.
Complies with Councils development plan for the Heritage precinct of the town.
No costs involved.

Cons

Impacts upon the view of the bay from the public seats and adjacent properties.

The comments received from the community will be collated and presented to Council at a meeting early in 2018. These comments will assist council in reaching a decision regarding:

- The future of the fence, and
- The eventual design of the fence.
