Medical Centre

With the knowledge of the importance of medical facilities to the community, Council continues to pursue a more acceptable response for Robe and others across the state.

I recently met with Member for Barker, Mr Tony Pasin, as a result, the following motion was put to the meeting of the Limestone Coast Local Government Association [LCLGA] formerly South East Local Government Association [SELGA]

“That LCLGA :

Write to the Federal Minister For Health expressing concern that rural and regional medical practices owned by Local Government or Community associations are excluded from accessing Federal Government Rural and Regional Infrastructure Grant (RRTIG) to upgrade medical centers to be able to accommodate interns and student doctors.”

2. Write to SAROC requesting that they survey rural and regional communities to ascertain the number of the Medical Practices that operate within council or community owned buildings.

3. Upon receipt of this information, LCLGA provide the information to Tony Pasin, Member for Barker, to enable him to present this information to the Minister for Health seeking changes to RRTI Grants.

FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE

Unexpected Cost Increases

Council use road making material obtained from what are referred to as *borrow pits*, areas on road reserves or within private property located close to the roads that are being re-sheeted. This practice is wide spread throughout rural South Australia and assists Councils in efficiently upgrading the rural unsealed road network. This material is raised and crushed at Councils expense and is only for Council use, Council does not sell this material.

The State Government together with the support of the opposition are enacting a legislative change which will see Councils having to pay the State Government a fee per tonne when this material is used on Council roads. This new fee will only effect rural Councils as metropolitan Councils do not access road materials in this manner nor do they have large kilometres of unsealed roads to maintain.

It is estimated that this will increase rural council's costs by approximately \$1 million dollars annually and Robe Council's costs by \$30,000 annually. The result of this impost is that Council will have to reduce the length of road that can be re-sheeted, or if Council wish to remain renewing between 15-17 kilometres of road annually rates would have to be increased by 1%.

Review of Councils 2014-2015 Budget

Council have completed a review of last year's budget versus actuals and it is very pleasing to report that Council budgeted to have an operating surplus of \$47,000 when in fact its audited operating surplus was \$166,000.

This result coupled with the fact that Council was able to undertake its capital and major works program in 2014-2015 without needing to borrow funds puts Council in a strong financial position and reflects the commitment made to financial management by the elected members and staff.

Council has allocated the following funds to Community organisations as part of its community grants program;

Work Health Safety

Council has made a commitment to improve its staff Work Health Safety procedures in recent times which is sometime considered an onerous task. However, as a result of the work undertaken by all staff in this field and the Councils good record in relation to accidents at work, Council has received a rebate of \$47,750 from the Local Government Association Workers Compensation Scheme.

Changes to Planning and Development

The State Government has legislation before Parliament proposing significant changes to the management of planning and development within the state.

The significant changes that are proposed are;

- Councils elected members will not be permitted to be members of the Development Assessment Panel that considers development applications, and
- Council's role in the development of planning regulations or changes to existing planning regulations has been altered so that Councils ability to influence such plan is significantly diminished.

Further information will be provided to the community as it becomes available.

Clearance of native vegetation in relation to fencing

Native Vegetation Regulation 5(1)(s)1 allows landholders to clear a strip of native vegetation up to 5m in width adjacent to the fence line to provide access for fence maintenance and construction only. The Regulation is limited to the following circumstance:

- The purpose of the fence must be for controlling access by people or the movement of animals.
- Where the clearance is for a new fence within the property boundary, the Regulation only applies if there is no practical alternative to siting the fence that would involve less or no clearance.
- The Regulation does not provide an automatic right to clear a 5m strip along a fence – whether within a property or on a property boundary. If there is native vegetation within 5m of the fence, and it does not impede reasonable access to the fence (for maintenance or construction), then the Regulation does not apply.
- The Regulation also applies to native vegetation protected under a Heritage Agreement, provided that the proposed fencing works are consistent with the terms of the Heritage Agreement.
- This Regulation does not extend to native vegetation growing on road reserves.

A landholder who wishes to clear native vegetation on a road reserve, to enable construction or maintenance of a boundary fence, requires consent from the Local Council as the "owner" of the road reserve. In granting any consent, the Local Council must comply with the following:

- Where the roadside vegetation consists largely of trees, only branches protruding through or overhanging the boundary fence, or trees growing on the actual fence alignment, should be removed.
- Where shrubs or bushes are growing through the fence line, those plants growing within one metre of the fence alignment can be removed.

The start of a new bushfire season is nearly upon us and it is time to start thinking of what we need to do to prepare. While fires are inevitable, they are also survivable. Whether you choose to leave early to go to a safer place or to stay and defend your well prepared home, planning and preparation is the key to survival. Preparing yourself, your family and your home is your responsibility. The more you prepare your home the better the chances are that it will survive a bushfire, even if you plan to leave well before a bushfire starts. Preparing is not just about property and plans it is also about considering your physical, mental and emotional preparedness. A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bushfire than one that hasn't. As a component of this, Council will again be conducting house and block inspections in and around Robe in the last week of October 2015. Council urges you to be Bushfire Ready by developing a Bushfire Action Plan and preparing your property for the impending bushfire season. Local Government Association—Keep planning local, have your say

What are the Planning System Reforms being proposed by the State Government?

The State Government is proposing to introduce reforms to the State's planning system—the first major reforms in more than 20 years. Good planning is the key to promoting quality design and creating public and built environs that meet the needs of the communities that live in them. Following two years of consultation, the Government introduced a Bill in September, which is currently before Parliament for consideration.

Why has the South Australian Government reviewed the State's Planning System?

The State Government is seeking to streamline the planning system and provide greater certainty in planning decisions for developers and communities. The Bill specifically aims to address lengthy development approval times, complex and confusing rules, patchy engagement with communities, contribute to urban renewal and create infrastructure that caters for the community.

Will the planning system reforms be good for South Australia?

We believe that sensible planning reforms will lead to positive development outcomes for South Australian communities. We need a more accessible, integrated and accountable system. However, this does not need to be at the expense of local input. We are concerned about a number of measures proposed in the draft Bill, in particular the potential for development decisions to be made by a central body, without consulting local communities through local government.

Without communities having a say on developments in their local community, there is potential for developments to be approved that could have undesirable outcomes on local areas.

Is Local Government against planning system reform?

We have long advocated for a better planning system and for sensible planning reforms on behalf of the communities we represent.

In fact, we believe a new system can deliver positive development outcomes for South Australian communities. We need a more accessible, integrated and accountable system.

However, we are concerned for a number of measures proposed in the draft Bill which reduce local involvement of Councils and communities. Our research shows that 60 percent of South Australians want to have more of a say in planning their own communities. Additionally, two thirds of South Australians think elected council members should be a decision maker on development applications.

What are the major impacts on the community if local residents don't have a voice in development decisions that impact on their region?

Without communities having a say on developments in their local area, there is potential for developments to be approved that do not meet their expectations. Local people know their area better than anyone and are more likely to understand how a development will impact on their community. Councils are the sphere of government closest to communities and best placed to consider the local impacts of development such as traffic, parking, storm water and local character and heritage.

What do we want the State Government to do?

We are calling on the State Government to listen to the community and reconsider the role of Councils and communities in setting zoning rules and in the development assessment process.

How can I prevent the community's voice from being shut-out of the debate on planning issues?

There is still opportunity to tell your Member of Parliament that you want the opportunity to be heard on planning rules and developments, but only if you contact them now.





MENTAL HEALTH WEEK 4th to 10th October 2015

Members of the Kingston & Robe Mental Health Support Group

Were outside the Robe Post Office on Friday 9th Oct. 2015 from 9am to 4pm.

Giving pens brochures and mental health information to more than 150 people.

Members talked to people, listened to people, and gave useful information to people.

This was a very successful day in promoting Mental Health Week and community awareness of Mental Health.

Facts about Mental Illness

The 2013 National Mental Health Commissions Contributing Life study identified the following facts about Mental Health in Australia:

- Up to 49% of Australians would avoid someone with a mental illness
- 37% of Australians wouldn't employ someone with Chronic Schizophrenia and 23% wouldn't employ someone with depression.
- About 60% of family members report experiencing negative, hurtful and offensive attitudes from the public.
- 65% of people who have experienced a mental health problem in the last 12 months have not sought help for that problem.
- A quarter of 16-24 year olds have experienced symptoms of a mental health problem in the last 12 months.
- About 50% of mental health problems emerge by the mid-teens, and 75% by age 25.
- Mental health peer workers are professionals who have a lived experience of mental illness, either personally or as a family member, and they bring this expertise to their work. Peer workers perform at least as well as other staff in reducing hospitalisation rates and levels of drug and alcohol use in the people they work with.
- 66% of people with psychotic illness smoke compared with 25% in the general population.
- Physical health is an important issue for all of us. People with severe mental illness die around 25 years younger than the rest of the population. The major causes of death are highly preventable such as cardio-vascular disease and diabetes.
- Public health campaigns and mental health services have failed regarding physical health of this segment of the population.

The Department of Environment, Water and Natural Resources (DEWNR) hereby issues an intent to undertake an aerial and ground-based non-retrieval fox baiting program in Reserves and associated beaches in the following areas:

- Coorong National Park (Aerial & Ground)**
- Canunda National Park (Aerial & Ground)**
- Beachport Conservation Park (Ground)**
- Little Dip Conservation Park (Ground)**
- Picaninnie Ponds Conservation Park (Ground)**

1080 POISON meat baits will be laid to destroy foxes and protect native fauna. Baits will no longer be retrieved and therefore it should be assumed that there are always active 1080 baits within the reserves. Permanent warning signs will be erected at all park entrances.

Baiting will occur during the following times:
Aerial – last week of May and October 2015.
Ground – August, October and December 2015.

These baits are lethal to dogs which are prohibited in reserves. Where dogs are permitted they must be leashed and in control of the owner at all times. Please ensure pets are correctly managed. The Department accepts no responsibility for pets that may be poisoned.

This program is a federally funded initiative for the protection of shorebirds in the South East, and is part of a regionally coordinated program in conjunction with the South East Natural Resource Management Board.
