In the last month it feels like we have fully settled into our roles and we are powering through a lot of work.

- The Robe Naturally concept continues to gain traction as we slowly work through ideas and a framework that will best serve the community. A summary of the outcomes from the first workshop is contained in the papers from the October Council meeting.
- The same process is occurring with the Aged Care idea. James and I visited Boneham Aged Care in Millicent to see how this facility runs and what we could learn from that model. We will continue to gather information from many sources and will present something to the community in the New Year.
- The Coastal Adaptation workshop in Millicent and the policy input session in Goolwa the following day were very informative and clearly showed us how these challenges are affecting us all. There is a lot of work going on in this space and we will need some professional assistance in collating all of the information into a form we can use.
- The SA Coastal Councils Alliance is doing some terrific work on behalf of those Councils who are grappling with the effects of climate change. This Alliance consists of Elected Members from across the state and will be essential in lobbying the State Government for funds.
- It was a terrific turnout to farewell Peter Riesley at the Institute on the 8 October. His passion and dedication have been hallmarks of his term in Local Government. As his final job for Council, we unveiled a plaque together commemorating the 150th year since the Institute was built.
- Finally, thank you to the members of Robe Probus for inviting me to speak at their meeting. I thoroughly enjoyed it (as you could tell by how long I spoke for!!) and I look forward to getting another opportunity to discuss Council business.

150 Year Anniversary of Council

On the 20 October, the District Council of Robe's communities came together to have a photo taken on the Robe foreshore to mark the 150th anniversary of Council. Special thanks to Edge Burton for donating his time to take the drone photo, the Robe Lions Club for hosting a BBQ after the photo and The Robe Bakery for donating a cake for the event.

The District Council of Robe was proclaimed on 28 October 1869. Also, a plaque was also unveiled by the Mayor on Monday 28 October at the Council Office to mark this occasion.

Final Plan for Robe's War Memorial

I am pleased to let the community know that after many years of planning and construction that a final plan has been approved by Council for Robe's War Memorial. The decision to refurbish the site around the cenotaph was made by Council in 2012/13. The project was originally scheduled over four years with the first stage of the project completed in time for the commemoration of the 100 years since the landing at Gallipoli by Australian soldiers. The project was to be fully completed by Remembrance Day 2018 which commemorated the 100 year anniversary of the end of the First World War.

The project is not complete. The new CEO set up a meeting with community members with an interest in the site on 23 September to agree to a final plan to complete the Robe War Memorial Redevelopment. Following the meeting a final plan was developed and signed off by the RSL.

Council, with the support of the designer, John Hinge will now implement the final components, including:

- Lighting (the lights are already purchased but power needs to be connected from the Institute and the lights installed)
- An external power point for services
- Paving at the eastern end (i.e. from the street to the new paving)
- Irrigation
- Planting
- Finalising the paving at the western end of the site

Fox Baiting in the South East

Council has been advised by the Department for Environment and Water that they will be undertaking fox baiting activities in the Little Dip Conservation Park. The fox baiting program involves the regular laying of semi-dried meat baits injected with poison as part of the fox control program. The aim is to enhance biodiversity conservation by reducing the impacts of fox predation on native fauna.

Vehicle based baiting will occur in the Little Dip Conservation Park during November-December 2019 and March-April 2020. These are non-retrieval baits and will be left in the parks to prolong availability to foxes. Baits remain active for some time and it should be assumed that there could always be active 1080 fox baits within the park boundaries.

Please note that these baits are lethal to dogs. Pet owners and adjacent landholders are responsible to ensure that pets or working dogs do not enter the area.



Infrastructure Update

Major Projects

- Installation of liners in the upgraded CWMS lagoons is nearly complete with water being pumped into the settling lagoon. The aerated lagoon lining should be completed soon and once quality assured, can be used to capture effluent
- Reconstruction of 2.1 kilometres of Fayrfield Lane is complete
- Council awarded a tender to construct a new niche wall at Robe Cemetery
- Council approved Administration partnering with Wattle Range Council on the procurement of dredging services for the Lake Butler Marina and channel

Parks and Recreation

Key activities this month include:

- Park benches, tables and the wooden rubbish bin units are being sanded and tidied up
- A replacement park seat has been installed at Lipson Park after the seat there was vandalised
- The CWMS trodes have been cleaned in the pump stations
- Checking of trip hazards in Victoria Street footpaths has been done
- Street sweeping throughout the town was done prior to the October long weekend
- Maintenance behind kerbs has commenced on town streets. This is ongoing work as time permits.

Rural Road Maintenance

Roads graded in the last month were Barnett Swamp Road, Baxter Hill Road, Boomeroo Park Road, Bowaka Road, Dairy Range Road, Old Naracoorte Road, Tea Tree Swamp Road and Drabsch Hundred Line.

Coastal Dynamics

As a follow on from Council's facilitated Coastal Dynamics workshop, Council has engaged Mark Weston from Integrated Coasts to undertake the Coastal Adaptation Scoping Study for the District Council of Robe.

This work has been commissioned because there are many reports over many years covering the District Council of Robe coastline, e.g. 'Robe: Guichen Bay Beach Ridge Plain', 'South East Coast Protection District Study Report', reports prepared regarding sand movements at Fox and Hoopers Beaches. These reports only provide part of the available data and information with reports and data held by Coast Protection Board, Flinders University, etc. A consolidated picture of what we have today and what the gaps are would provide the basis for Council to engage with community to understand the issues we face together.

The Coastal Adaptation Scoping Study will provide a baseline report to:

- Identify the coastal climate adaptation context for Robe;
- Locate all historical reports, studies, and correspondence and bring these all into one place;
- Identify the key coastal issues in the region;
- Identify existing data sources (such as a Digital Elevation Model), and make recommendation in regard to future data needs;
- Provide a preliminary risk assessment for the township area (north facing);
- Formulate the framework for ongoing coastal adaptation study; and
- Provide the basis for the Council to obtain further funding for specialist areas of study.

Through this process it will answer:

- What do we know? (We want to build on any past work)
- What do we need to know? (What are the data gaps?)
- Where to from here? (Recommendations for moving forward)

Following receipt of the report and the implications for Robe, a community meeting will be held to discuss the findings.

Also in relation to the issue we face on the coastline, Council will be discussing a Discussion Paper, Funding for Local Government Coastal Management and Protection, issued on behalf of all South Australian coastal councils. This will occur at the October Elected Members Forum.

Cross Border Relationships

On behalf of your Council, I was privileged to be invited to a dinner with Victoria's Cross Border Commissioner, Luke Wilson and Councils across the Limestone Coast Council and South West Victoria. The Councils in attendance from Victoria were:

We operate with the principle of boundaries being lines on the map and therefore, if we ignore them, there are many opportunities that present. From the Cross Border Commissioner's perspective, the boundaries create issues between Victoria, South Australia, New South Wales and Tasmania such as:

Tourism promotion
Access to TAFE/VET
Fishing and boating
Mobile blackspots
Rail freight
Load limits
Road rules, e.g. differences for learners and provisional drivers
Taxi licences and operation
Liquor licencing
Trade licences

In fact, he mentioned that he has a list of 200 cross border regulatory and practice differences. Communities are impacted by these differences and any work to remove the barriers will benefit all Australians.

Quantifying Robe's Population

As a tourist destination, Robe has a highly variable population with the peak often quoted between 10,000 and 22,000 people, with the stand figure most often being stated as 15,000. The source of the different estimates given is not known. Having a good estimate is important for Council's long range planning to improve the material and social lives of our residents and visitors, through better understanding of what resources are required and in what areas. For example, the information is critical for urban planning and for the provision of key public services such as waste water treatment, water, power, access to food services during peak periods, vehicle parking, economic development planning and measurement, resources for our Visitor Information Centre, grant funding, comparative data for benchmarking, etc.

Therefore, it is pleasing that Council has approved the appointment of Geografia who use a proprietary tool called Spendmapp to accurately measure event impact and track economic growth, visitor numbers and escape expenditure. Spendmapp uses bank data to track transactions and this data will be used to estimate visitor numbers and will be compared to secondary data (e.g. water usage, waste water flows) for validation. This tool will allow month by month numbers to be captured and used in Council's planning and reporting.

An opportunity for Community Groups

The Macpac team are passionate about protecting the environment and its wildlife, having a lasting positive impact on people's lives through the outdoors, and supporting the communities connected with Macpac. Macpac award modest contributions of between \$2,000 -10,000 to those organisations who align with their ideals.

The groups they support fall into one of three areas:

- Adventure-Based Social Development: Macpac support community organisations to run programs designed to rehabilitate, reform, or generally improve lives through experiences in the outdoors.
- Environmental Projects: The Macpac Fund for Good supports projects working hard to preserve the natural environment, restore and protect habitats, and to look after the creatures that call them home.
- Ethical Manufacturing: To meet Macpac's high standards, their factories are carefully selected for their ethical practices as well as their quality and commitment to innovation.

Have your say on Jetties in South Australia

The State Government is in the process of developing a SA Jetties Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan will broadly review all 68 jetties, region by region, and develop a holistic long-term approach to managing our jetties that will:

- Assess the economic and community outcomes, benefits and usage of jetties;
- Deliver sustainable options for ongoing jetty safety, management and maintenance;
- Guide future infrastructure investment decisions; and
- Channel funds to priority areas to maximise benefits to the community and business.

The first stage of this review is capturing community, local government and stakeholder views. To help inform the development of the Strategic Plan we want to gain a broad understanding of how jetties:

- Contribute to the economy;
- Benefit the community; and
- Are used by local communities, visitors and businesses.

Have your say on Planning and Design Code Phase 2 (Rural Areas)

The Planning and Design Code (the Code) is the cornerstone of South Australia's new planning system. The Code will replace all development plans to become the single source of planning policy for assessing development applications across the state.

The Code will provide South Australians with planning policy that is consistent and clear, making the planning process quicker, simpler and more equitable. This will help the community to navigate the planning system when building a house, developing a business or progressing large commercial developments.

The Code is being progressively introduced across South Australia, commencing in the outback before moving to regional council areas and concluding in Greater Adelaide.

Robe – The Start of the Great Victorian Bike Ride

The following article was developed for the Back 2 Bikes newsletter and is provided as part of the 'Community Newsletter' to provide background on the event.



Robe is hosting the start of the Great Victorian Bike Ride in late November with almost 5,000 riders arriving in the town on Friday 22 November and launching off on their ride along the Limestone Coast on Saturday. The Great Victorian Bike Ride provides bike riders with an affordable, supported cycling and camping holiday. The event is challenging and fun with a friendly community environment. It's a week in another world!

This is the 36th year of the event run by The Bicycle Network. The Bicycle Network is a charity and one of the largest cycling membership organisations in the world. They believe that "2019 is going to be the greatest Great Vic ever". Participants will pedal over 10 days, covering more than 600 kilometres through the beautiful coastal and forest landscapes along the Limestone Coast, the Great Ocean Road and through the Great Otway National Park. Riders be challenged with daily distances of between 50 kilometres and 107 kilometres.



The route for the 2019 for the Great Victorian Bike Ride is a spectacular route taking in South Australia's Stunning Limestone Coast and making it's way through to the iconic Great Ocean Road and the Otways. Starting the ride in Robe riders will trek to Milllicent via the coast, the next day take the riders to Mt Gambier. Riders will then make the journey back to Victoria arriving in Portland which will be the longest day of riding on the event. Port Fairy is the riders' next destination and a rest day. At Port Fairy, riders will farewell the first four day ticket holders and welcome the second group of riders. From Port Fairy riders will continue heading east to the small town of Peterborough. Notorious Lavers Hill will follow Peterborough. Riders will tackle this challenging climb before finishing in Beech Forest. Continuing through the magical Otway's riders will make it to Deans Marsh for their last night in their tents. The final day of riding will conclude in the beautiful surf coast town of Torquay.

Robe – The Start of the Great Victorian Bike Ride...

Proclaimed as a port in 1847, Robe is located 338 kilometres south east of Adelaide and 520 kilometres west of Melbourne on Guichen Bay. Robe's long history includes the District Council of Robe being formed in 1869 and therefore in October this year the Council turns 150. It is one of the most attractive historic towns in South Australia and well-known holiday destination combining a dramatic rocky, windswept coastline with a number of attractive and secluded beaches including the beautiful 17km-long Long Beach. It is notable for its very sophisticated and charming town centre with 76 state and locally registered buildings.



The town's distinctive combination of historical buildings, ocean, fishing fleets, lakes and dense bush is widely appreciated. During peak holidays periods Robe accommodates large numbers of holidaymakers and other visitors estimated to peak at between 15,000 and 17,000. This influx of visitors has resulted in the township developing high numbers of accommodation providers, restaurants and cafes, antique and gift shops, and galleries which cater for these visitors.

Robe has a strong connection with Victoria as many of Robe's non-residential ratepayers come from South West Victoria. Also, in 1857 Robe gained widespread infamy when Chinese gold miners trying to avoid the taxes imposed at Victorian ports landed at Robe and walked 200 miles (322 kilometres) to Ballarat and Bendigo in search of gold. In that year some 16,500 Chinese miners landed at Robe. The reason was simple. Victoria were charging £10 per person for entry to the state. This was more than the Chinese were paying for their sea voyage to Australia.

80 percent of the riders for this year's event are from Victoria. However, there are many other visitors from all around Australia joining Great Victorian Bike Ride and for all participants, it is an amazing opportunity to see Robe, a beautiful coastal town, first hand. Also, in support of the event Robe Tourism Association is hosting the Robe Christmas Night Markets on 22 November from 4.30 pm to 8.30 pm.

As a background to the event the following statistics are interesting:

- Cycling holiday involving up to 5,000 people
- 40 percent of the riders are school groups
- The majority of our riders are male (60% male/40% female)
- 85% are aged between 40-70

During this visit, participants in the Great Victorian Bike Ride will see why Robe is a sustainable, vibrant, harmonious and prosperous place to live, work and visit.



The meals can be delivered as Chilled or Frozen. Meals cannot be left unattended at your door. Chilled main meals should be refrigerated until use and must be eaten within 24 hours of delivery. Frozen meals must be put into a freezer immediately.




