DEPUTY MAYOR'S REPORT & COUNCIL NEWS

Mayor Riseley Appreciation

With our Mayor Peter Riseley currently overseas, it gives me a great opportunity to express my, and fellow Councillors, appreciation for the dedication that Peter puts into the important role of Robe Mayor. Peter has genuine care for the welfare of the community, he is extremely conscientious and accountable in all dealings with ratepayers, the many committees he is on, the council staff and elected members. Thank you Peter – don't think of retiring.

Aged Care/Retirement

The establishment of a retirement/aged care facility for Robe was a priority of mine when I was elected to Council, at that time there were 2 – 3 different committees looking at the issue. It is the community services and ratepayers highest priority. It is still a priority of mine to see how we can best cater for the ageing population in our community. After three years we have no plan, we don't even have a committee. Are we waiting on the outcome of the Golf Club land? I suggest we get all the previously interested parties together to work out what model of aged care is possible for Robe and how it could be funded. We would then know what area of land is required for the project.

Clean Up Around Lake Butler Marina

Recently some invasive plant species were cleared from near the Fishermen's Memorial around to the Star of Sea Church. The Authorised Officer of Animal & Plant Control is applying for funding to continue the eradication program around the walking path to the recreational boat ramp car park. Some comment from the Elected Members and the community would be welcomed, along with some volunteers if the project continues.

WORKS REPORT

Town maintenance in the last fortnight has mainly concentrated on the Main Street area with tree trimming, poisoning etc. The PLEC project on the corner of Hagen and Sturt Street has been completed, underground irrigation will be installed before spring. The safety of this corner has improved with the removal of the stobie pole and some vegetation. Maintenance work on the pump controller for the storm water at Lannum Park has been undertaken. The controller and the pumps were installed in 1988 and Council will have to consider an upgrade in the future budgets. Work on Wrights Bay Road is continuing. On Saturday 27 July we had 37 Works Managers and Supervisors from the Adelaide Hills spend the weekend in Robe. They had a tour of Robe including Beacon Hill, the new CWMS pond, Marina and walking trails. They seemed most impressed with our town in which I displayed in a positive light.

Roads graded in the last month were Bagdad Road, Old Naracoorte Road, Long Island Road, Nora Creina Road, Fayrefield Lane, Shamrock Road, Powells Road, Sandy Lane, Steve Woolston Road and Davenport Street.



I went overseas on Annual Leave. Though in a foreign-speaking country, I found that there is still a common language when communicating with children. Cuddles, frowns, smiles, sighs, stomping, tickling, clapping, waving, shouting, boo-hooing, and shivering all make sense to children. They understand. Sometimes at child care, this is how we begin to reassure little ones, to calm them, and let them feel comfortable and ready to explore. To find out what it is like to be at care with many others. We watch how parents calm their own child, we mirror those actions so that children will feel the familiarity. It is such a big step for little ones...and their parents, to come into a foreign space and learn how to communicate effectively with others. Carers and educators learn to 'speak' to each other in different ways too. A wink, a raised eyebrow, a clicking tongue can speak volumes. It is such a joy, and such a relief when children are able to speak, and express their needs and feelings. But in the meantime we need to be really aware of all the signs and signals they are giving us. Our staff use some basic sign language as part of their communication with children who have not yet found their words. It is amazing how children can interpret what is happening around them. Being patient and "tuned in" to each child is a skill that CCOWS staff practise each day.

External Funding

Council has been successful in obtaining external funding for the following projects;

• Coastal Walking Trail

Council has been successful in its application for funding for a grant of \$100,000 to undertake the construction of the coastal trail between Drain L and the McIntyre Reserve. No decision has been made with respect to the surface treatment of this trail and the project will not commence until a Council decision has been made on this issue.

• Repairs to Groyne Town Beach

The groyne located at the eastern end of Town Beach is in need of repair, the rocks adjacent to the beach have either sunk or been washed away which allows the wave action to move sand from Town Beach in a northerly direction. Council has secured funding of \$15,000 from the Coast Protection Board for this work and will be undertaking repairs to the groyne later in 2013.

• Robe 2040 Plan

Council has been successful in its application for funding of \$40,000 for the second stage of the Robe 2040 Plan.

• SELGA – Caring for Country

In partnership with the Dept Environment, Water and Natural Resources (DEWNR) and the Limestone Coast and Coorong Coastal Management Group, an application was submitted for Caring for Our Country Funding in April 2013. The project is called Limestone Coast-watchers, and seeks to engage community to improve the health and report on the condition of our coast. The application was supported by Wattle Range, Kingston, Grant and Robe Councils. The project required no cash contribution by the South East Local government Association (SELGA) or individual councils. As the lead agency SELGA was notified late last week that the application was successful in winning \$980,300 over 5 years to 2018.

Grant funding

Council receives two grants annually from the Federal Government without the need to make application which are;

I. Financial Assistance Grants (FAG's) – which are funds provided by the Federal Government and administered by the South Australian Grant Commission. Council's allocation is determined by a complex formula that compares our Councils revenues and expenditures with the Local Government state wide average. The Council will receive \$31,340 in the current financial year and the grants are untied meaning Council can expend the funds as its annual business plan and budget dictate. Robe Council receives the lowest amount of grants for any Councils within South Australia because in simple terms Robes population is small, the district has high value properties and its level of rates collected are low in comparison.

II. Road Grants – the District Council of Robe will receive \$150,000 in general road funding and \$36,393 Roads to Recovery funding in the current financial year. These grants must be spent on Councils road infrastructure.

Aside from these two sources of funds Council are always looking for grants to assist Council in providing services and infrastructure for the community. While grants are a good source of external funding Council needs to be very careful and consider when it applies for grants because grant funding can have a negative impact upon the operation of Council.

- Most grants require \$ for \$ contribution from Council and therefore are a cost to Council.
- Council need to be certain that the project applied for is part of Councils long term plans and that Council are not doing the project simply because grant funding is available.
- Grants are available for new projects but are not available for the maintenance of the project and therefore the maintenance costs remain the responsibility of Council and the community.
- Grant applications are becoming increasingly detailed and complex to complete and can divert staff from undertaking Councils core business.

Lake Butler – weed removal

Council has undertaken the removal of some of the woody weeds (Olives , Norfolk Island Hibiscus etc) around Lake Butler and upon completion of the project replanting and regeneration of the endemic plants will take place .

Robe Institute

As all are aware there has been water issues associated with the Robe Institute and Library which have damaged the building and the furniture and fittings within the building.

Richard Woods (Heritage Architect) has been engaged to assist staff draw up plans for the building which will ensure that all the issues are addressed in a coordinated manner. The works undertaken will involve;

- Re roofing the Library
- Additional drain pipes, gutter guard and rain heads on existing gutters
- Gravel path and footpath protecting the walls from surface moisture
- Ventilation to assist in drying out internal walls

Council has commenced work on the Library roof and will be allocating further funds to ensure that the building is protected and continues to be a valuable community asset.

Cruise ships visiting Robe

The Limestone Coast Regional Tourism has secured P&O Cruise Ship visits into Robe over the next couple of years as follows:

- *23rd April 2014 (1800 passengers with 514 crew)*
- *26th February 2015 (1900 passengers with 620 crew)*
- *7th March 2015 (1900 passengers with 620 crew)*
- *15th February 2016 (1900 passengers with 620 crew)*
- *1st March 2016 (1900 passengers with 620 crew)*

The SATC have also appointed Ms Jodie Pftzner, as an Event Manager for all on-shore activities with Cruise-Ship visits which will greatly assist our local community and volunteers prepare for these events. The visits by the cruise ships and their passengers are an excellent way to advertise the attractions of Robe and the Limestone Coast with view to encouraging return visits.

Beach Access Strategy

The foreshore dunes are vital to the protection of our coastline and the protection of the manmade structures built on or behind the dunes and therefore it is in the community's best interests that the dunes do not become damaged and unstable. Recognizing that pedestrian traffic through the dunes contributes to the instability of the dunes, Council have engaged Access Planning to prepare a Beach Access Strategy to manage the pedestrian access across the coastal dunes and foreshore areas from Town Beach to and including Long Beach. Prior to adoption of the Beach Access Strategy by Council, Council will engage the community seeking their comments on the strategy and will amend the strategy in line with the comments received where appropriate. Council will also use the strategy to obtain funding to undertake works required to assist with the movement of people over the dunes in a way that will protect the dunes.

Reminder

Dog registrations are due by 31 August 2013



Council will be conducting a door knock this year checking dog registrations, so if you are an owner of a dog over 3 months old it needs to be registered with Council.

Registration helps identify your dog, aids in his/her return to you and can cut down on expensive fines.
