Koning Willem de Tweede Shipwreck Project Presentation

On the evening of Friday 12th April at the Robe Institute, the Australian National Maritime Museum, along with the Cultural Heritage Agency of the Netherlands, Silentworld Foundation, & the Robe Branch National Trust of South Australia, held a public presentation and launched a booklet as part of the ongoing Koning Willem de Tweede Shipwreck Project. Titled 'Wrecks and Relics: Looking After Maritime Archaeological Finds in the Robe Region', the booklet discussed Dutch ties to Robe's maritime past, the preservation and stabilization of maritime cultural heritage, and pertinent State and Commonwealth heritage legislation. Copies of the free booklet were handed out on the night, but if you missed outnever fear! Extra copies are available at the Robe Customs House.

Supper was provided by the Robe Branch National Trust featuring Dutch specialties for attendees to enjoy. The following morning, a workshop on conserving and caring for archaeological artifacts took place at the Robe Customs House Maritime Museum.

Dr. James Hunter from the project gave the approximately 50 attendees an update on what has been found so far, and what the next steps will be in their search for the wreck site. The project's primary goal is to search for, locate, and conduct an archaeological survey of the historic ship's remains. Additionally, the project team, in collaboration with the local community, aim to document any privately or publicly held items recovered from the wreck and offer conservation guidance for their future preservation.

Koning Willem de Tweede, an 800-ton Dutch barque, met its end off Guichen Bay's Long Beach on June 30, 1857, resulting in the loss of 16 lives. Just before this tragedy, over 400 Chinese miners en route to the gold fields in Bendigo and Ballarat, Victoria, disembarked from the vessel.

The Koning Willem de Tweede Shipwreck Project received support from the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, facilitated through the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Australia, and the Cultural Heritage Agency of the Netherlands.







<u>Customs House Project Update</u>

We are pleased to announce that work has been mostly completed on the restoration of the historic Robe Customs House. The front facade has been repointed and had some stones and bricks replaced. The stonemasons have also repaired compromised timber framing as well as replacing broken and missing louvres in the vents. This exterior work is now virtually complete, and future internal maintenance works will be investigated and prioritised.

The craftsmanship and attention to detail on this project have been outstanding and we couldn't be more pleased with the results, ensuring this icon of Robe remains standing for generations to come.



LIMESTONE COAST SOUTHERN REGIONAL ASSESSMENT PANEL CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST - INDEPENDENT MEMBERS FIVE VACANCIES

District Council of Grant, Wattle Range Council, District Council of Robe and City of Mount Gambier formed the Limestone Coast Southern Regional Assessment Panel (LCSRAP) which commenced on 1 July 2022.

Expressions of interest are being sought from members of the public who would like to be considered for appointment as an independent member of the Regional Assessment Panel (LCSRAP). The role of the LCSRAP is to make decisions on a wide range of development applications within the respective council areas.

The LCSRAP is to be comprised of five members who have an interest in urban and regional planning with appropriate qualifications and experience. As a guide, it is anticipated that independent members could come from the field of architecture, landscape architecture, civil engineering, planning, law, building, environmental planning or similar fields. It is a requirement that all members of the LCSRAP obtain accreditation from Plan SA as Planning Level 2 to be able to be a member of the panel.



Independent members will be compensated for their time and expertise. The term of the LCSRAP is for a two year period.

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- · You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.





Drooping Sheoak (Allocasuarina verticillata).

The drooping sheoak is a native tree recognized for its unique, evergreen, needle-like foliage that forms a drooping canopy. This hardy tree, generally reaching 5-10 metres in height, is adaptable to a wide range of soil types. It has distinct woody cones and seasonal reddish-brown flowers. Requires planting during the autumn months and can be used as a windbreak. The initial years require consistent watering. The sheoak can be planted in either full sun or partial shade.





Brown Stringybark (Eucalyptus baxteri).

A medium-sized tree that is native to the southeastern Australia. It has rough, stringy bark and a curved adult leaf. Beautiful green to yellow flower buds form in groups. Note: this tree can grow to a height of 40 metres. It is recommended that it be planted in a large sized garden or block during autumn. The seeds are an important source of food for the endangered south-eastern red-tailed cockatoo.















Dryland tea tree (Melaleuca lanceolata).

A South Australian native small tree which can grow to 1 - 8 metres in height. This will grow well in frontline coastal situations as well as inland regions. Required planting in alkaline soils during autumn. Flowers are white or cream in large clusters and flower during the summer months. The Dryland tea tree is a hardy plant which will grow on loam soils, brown, grey or white sand, limestone ridges, coastal cliffs and dunes.



What we're doing

We are undertaking a project to improve the reliability of the power supply in the township of Robe. This includes the replacement of 1.3 kilometers of high-voltage overhead powerline, along with 23 stobie poles and overhead equipment at 50 current stobie pole locations. The upgrades are required due to coastal corrosion of the local network.

The map gives an indication of the area impacted.

How this affects you

Civil works are scheduled to commence in late April and are expected to finish by the end of May. This work involves installing new stobie pole foundations beneath existing power lines and preparing for underground cables for a road crossing at 2 Sturt Street Robe.

Following the civil works, overhead powerline and stobie pole installations are set to begin in June, with completion anticipated by the end of August. We aim to complete all work by September this year.

To ensure the safety of both our workers and the community, we will implement traffic management measures. Access to businesses will be maintained using road plates and stop/go traffic management. Speed restrictions and parking limitations will also be in the place near our work sites.

As part of the project, some private electricity connections may require alterations. There will be no cost to customers for this work and you will be notified in advance if your property is affected.

The majority of the work will be conducted during daylight hours, with the possibility of some weekend work. We will inform you in advance if there is any night works. Work won't be conducted every day during this period and project timeframes may change due to unforeseen issues.

Generation

We will have generation in place in August over two days at 1 Evans Road, Robe to minimise power outages. During its operation, soundproofing measures will be in place, however there may still be some noise disturbance.

Power outages

Customers will experience power outages during some of this work, as we cannot provide generation to prevent all outages. We will send SMS/ emails to subscribed customers typically two weeks before the planned outage. We post cards to non-subscribed customers however there may be delays with the postal service.

If you do not already receive free SMS/ email updates about your power, you can subscribe using the QR code below, via our website, or call us for assistance.

You need the National Meter Identifier (NMI) from your electricity bill to subscribe.

Nuisance

There will be dust, vibration and noise from our work, the generator, and the operation of heavy machinery and vehicles such as cranes, however our crews will minimise these disruptions as much as possible.






