

Mayor's Report

Resignation Cr Kristina Alexander

On behalf of the community and Council colleagues, I would like to acknowledge and thank Cr Alexander for her considerable effort and contribution to the Robe community over the past 7 years.

Kristina had close contact with the community and was always able to contribute a view point that closely reflected that of the broader community. Thank you for your service and all the best in your future endeavors.

Supplementary Election

The vacancy created with the resignation of Cr Alexander creates a very unique opportunity for an aspirant keen to trial the position of Elected Member. From the time of appointment it will be only 14 months to the next periodic Local Government elections. This provides a trial period to ascertain if the role is one the person can manage.

Council would urge any person keen on the role to seek further information by contacting the Office. Also take the opportunity to speak with one or more of the current Elected Members or myself. Telephone numbers are available on the website or rear of the monthly newsletter.

The Chinese Long March

On the 26th of May I joined the walkers for the final 16.5 kilometre march to the Victorian Parliament House. It was a privilege to be there representing the Robe community.

The address by the Victorian Premier the Honorable Daniel Andrews included an apology for the 10 pound poll tax. This was followed by a similar response from the shadow Premier Guy Mathews. The response from the descendants present was emotional and very moving.

Robe received recognition for its part in the Great March and also it's contributing Chinese festival.

Sea Vu Caravan Park

While Mr. Peden has a particular view in relation to the management of the Sea Vu Caravan Park I believe it is important that the community are provided with the correct information relating to Councils proposal to undertake capital works at the Caravan Park.

The Park and the permanent fixtures within the Park (Community Assets) are owned by the Council. Council receives a market rent for the park. The Caravan Park lease contains the opportunity for regular rent reviews to be conducted which ensure that rent that Council receives payable reflects the value of the Park.

Mr. Peden appears to have difficulty understanding the difference between obligation and responsibility.

Council has received legal advice regarding its obligations and responsibilities in relation to the assets within the Caravan Park and Mr. Peden has been provided with a copy of this legal advice.

This advice is public and located on Councils website (under 'Latest News' on the homepage), should any of the readers wish to access the advice.

Council has no legal obligation to undertake capital upgrades of its assets within the Caravan Park.

Council does however have a responsibility to its community to ensure that the assets that it manages on behalf of the community in a condition that is "fit for purpose" which includes the assets within the Caravan Park.

Council has a responsibility to ensure that all its assets do not pose a risk to public safety which is why Council are also upgrading electrical and water infrastructure at the Park.

Council also has a responsibility to ensure that the community receives an appropriate financial return from the assets at the Caravan Park.

Council is proposing to upgrade the toilet block and other infrastructure at the Caravan Park to ensure that the parks facilities are "fit for purpose". Continually maintaining the Parks assets will result in the Park continuing to be well patronised which will result an increased rent being received by Council.

Conversely the opposite is true, if the facilities at the Park are run down and not in good condition patronage will fall away and future rent reviews will result in less rent being able to be collected from the Park.

I trust that the information contained in this letter clarifies Councils reasons for considering the upgrade of the facilities at the Park and corrects the misinformation that has been circulated by Mr. Peden.

Robe Foreshore Fence

Council is still awaiting advice in relation to the appropriateness of the recently constructed foreshore fence. Engineering staff and risk management staff have inspected the foreshore and the fence and Council are waiting on their report which hopefully will be presented for consideration by Council at the July Council meeting.

Parking on Road verges

Local Government through the Local Government Association of South Australia are working towards amending the Australian Road Rules 1999 to allow for the legal parking of vehicles on the nature strip (verge).

If Local Government in S.A. are successful in achieving this change it will assist in managing congestion on the narrow streets within Robe during the holiday season and legalise what already occurs in many instances.

Supplementary Election

Council have received the resignation of Councillor Kristina Alexander and therefore in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act, Local Government Elections Act and Councils policy, a supplementary election will be held to fill in the vacancy on Council.

The election will be managed by the South Australian Electoral Commission with Paula Bigmore holding the position of Council Liaison Officer for the purposes of the election.

The voting for the election will be by postal voting.

Mail-out of voting material: Tuesday 18 July—Monday 24th July 2017

Close of voting: 12noon, Monday 7th August 2017

Scrutiny and count: 9am, Tuesday 8th August 2017

I would encourage all members of the community to be involved in this democratic process.

Changes to Development Assessment

The State Government has introduced legislation that will change how development assessment is undertaken within the Council.

The new legislation, Planning Development Infrastructure Act, is the most significant change to planning legislation since the early 1970's when state wide planning controls were introduced.

The legislation is being implemented over a number of years and as these changes occur, Council will be advising the community via this newsletter and information on Councils website.

In response to the new legislation, Council has reduced the membership of the Council Assessment Panel to 5 members and reduced Councils representatives on the panel from three to one.

Council's representative upon the panel is Mayor Peter Riseley.

Council would like to thank outgoing members Cr Lawrie Polomka and Cr David Loxton for their input into the panel during their tenure as Council representatives.

The new legislation makes its mandatory for members of the Councils Assessment Panel to be "accredited professionals" by July 2018.

The new legislation provides the opportunity for Councils to establish regional or subregional Assessment Panels.

The Limestone Coast Local Government Association is undertaking a review of the operation of its members Councils Panels and investigating the opportunities to establish regional or subregional panels.

Based upon the information presented as part of this study, Council will make a decision as to whether it supports the establishment of regional or subregional panels.

Cemetery Advisory Group

Council welcomes the following as members of Councils cemetery Advisory Group:

Community members – Mr Kim Kelly and Ms Marcia Denning-Wasson, and

Robe Branch of the National Trust member Ms Valarie Monaghan.

This group assists in providing Council with advice regarding the management of Councils Public cemetery.

Council Financial Reporting

In order that Council improve its standard of financial reporting, Council has made changes to the reports that are placed in the monthly Council agenda.

These reports have been provided as Council recognised that it needed to concentrate on:

- Is the expenditure on major operational activities within budget allocations, are there any identifiable trends which will affect the operational budget,
- Are Council allocating sufficient funds for asset (building, marina and roads) maintenance and renewal,
- Are Council providing services that the community require and at the level they require,
- Are Councils services providing value for the community,
- Are Council meeting our goals as set by Councils financial key performance indicators in relation to the management of debt, assets management and operational surplus or deficits.

The new reports detail:

- A schedule of Councils operating activities at a program level, and
- A schedule of the Councils capital projects.

While Council understand that a section of the community appears to be very focused on the list of creditors payments included in the council agenda, the production of this information does not add value to the management of Councils finances as the information is not timely (focusses on the past) and provides no insights into how Council's budget is being managed. Nor does it assist in managing how goods and services are purchased.


Business Signage

In cooperation with the local businesses, Council will be erecting an Industrial Estate sign at the corner of Robe Street and Victoria Street. This sign will provide the facilities for businesses located in the industrial estate to be able to direct customers to their premises and will remove the need to clutter the intersection with A Frame signs.

This action is part of Councils strategy to tidy up the business precinct of the town and ensure that all businesses comply with Councils sign by-law and restrict the A frame signs to one per business located adjacent their business.

Temporary Road Closure

Mundy Terrace between the Royal Circus and Bagot Street will be closed to traffic on Friday 18th August 2017 between the hours of 11.30am and 2.00pm for the purpose of an event associated with the Variety Club Bash.



The Victorian Premier has apologised to the Chinese Community for the racist and unjust policies endured by their ancestors during the Gold Rush era. In a moving speech, Premier Daniel Andrews apologised to a crowd of Chinese community leaders and several descendants of the original first wave of miners at the completion of the re-enactment of the 'Great Walk from Robe'.

Between 1857 and 1863 almost 20,000 determined Chinese men and one woman arrived in Australia seeking a better life for their family. It was a time of grinding poverty, lawlessness and oppression in many parts of China and families worked together to send a representative to the Australian goldfields to seek a supplementary income for those left at home. This was a difficult decision for the Chinese who came from a traditional culture that focused heavily on parents, family and the ancestral village.

On their arrival in Victoria, after a long and perilous sea voyage, the Victorian government imposed a 10 pound fee on the migrants to disembark. This was a hefty sum and would have equalled several years' worth of wages, leaving the migrants facing massive debts which they were then required to work off.

To avoid the tax many miners choose to disembark in Robe, South Australia, and walk the 500kms across wild and rugged terrain to the Victorian goldfields. Some died of starvation or exhaustion along the way and those who survived endured adversity and racism that would be untenable today.

To mark the 160th anniversary of this remarkable journey a group of Chinese-Australians, including several descendants of the original migrants, walked from Robe to Melbourne to meet the Premier at the Victorian Parliament in May this year.

Sending the walkers off from Robe was treated as a celebration for the Robe Community. With the assistance of the regional councils, the Robe District Council, the Robe Tourism Association and a dynamic team of volunteers lead by event coordinator Jamie Aitken, Robe became a hub of Chinese music, art and culture across the weekend.

The newly erected 'Pai Fang' (welcome gate) on the shoreline at Robe was also officially opened and blessed during the weekend making for a spectacular parade along Robe's main street and foreshore. Dragon Boat races were held on Robe's stunning Lake Fellmongery, Limestone Coast food and wine were on display in the main pavilion and Lion Dancers, drums and crackers mixed with the local primary school and football team as Robe also celebrated 2017 as the Chinese Year of the Rooster (Robe's official emblem).

Representatives from the Robe Tourism Association as well as the Robe Mayor were also present for the arrival of the walkers on the steps of the Victorian Parliament House. Geoff Denning (vice-chairman of the Robe Tourism Association) said "The Mayor and myself were shepherded into almost every photo as the 'Robe faces'. The interest in Robe was incredible and the Chinese community leaders walked away with such a great impression of Robe. Our hospitality and our respect was held in very high regard by all involved".

Event coordinators from Robe look forward to an ongoing relationship with the Chinese-Australian Community. Mayor Peter Riseley said, "The weekend was terrifically received by the locals. It was bright, fun, entertaining and enabled our children to really immerse themselves in our dynamic history and to learn from those who had a very different introduction to the shores of Robe".

Robetown CFS Brigade – More Volunteers Required

The CFS Mission: To protect life, property and the environment from fire and other emergencies whilst protecting and supporting our personnel and continuously improving. We're the people you sometimes see on television, fighting bushfires and helping our community in times of emergency.

It's a real team effort and we are looking for team players with differing skills. You don't have to be holding the hose fighting fires, we also need people to do things e.g. operating the radio, logistics, administration and lots more. You never know the challenges you'll be facing, but one thing's for sure - it will never be boring.

"A healthy community needs active participants" Many current volunteers say they joined the CFS to protect and help their local communities. And the pay? Well, there isn't any. But the rewards are many - learning new skills, keeping fit, gaining valuable qualifications, earning respect within the community, having fun, and being part of an active team. We really do make a difference. We've got the gear, we've got the experience, we'll train you and we'll equip you. All you need to bring along is your energy and your enthusiasm.

The Robetown CFS Brigade is unique in South Australia, as it has several specially trained Brigade members. This enables the Brigade to attend varying incidents e.g. Fire (Bush, grass, forest and Structural), Confined Space, Hazardous materials, Road Crash Rescue (RCR), Vertical Rescue and SES type incidents. Also, the Brigade has several specially trained members to assist the CFS Air Wing until a Support Brigade arrives from Millicent or Naracoorte.

Recently the Brigade received a new appliance, Robe 34P, (twin cab Pumper), which is fitted out as our Robe Town Hazmat unit, this Hazmat appliance also covers the Kingston area. Robe 34P compliments Robe 24P (twin cab Pumper) which is now set up as a RCR unit. In late May, the Robetown Brigade received a new 13,000lt Bulk Water Carrier (BW13), replacing its old 7,000lt Bulk Water Carrier (BW7).






