Statistics from the 2022 Election

The Electoral Commission of South Australia has provided the overall statistics for the 2022 elections. Across the State, there were 1,258 candidates contesting the 184 elections. This was slightly lower than the 1,474 candidates at the 2018 elections. For the District Council of Robe, we had 12 candidates contesting one election for the six councillor positions. As previously advised, there were no nominations for the position of Mayor.

Across the State, the voters roll increased from 1,208,858 in 2018 to 1,243,661 in 2022. Participation was slightly above the 2018 figure of 389,215 ballots received (32.94%), having received 429,617 ballots (34.54%). Like many rural councils, participation was significantly higher. Of the total 1,376 electors on the Robe Electoral Roll, 943 formal ballot papers (or 68.5 percent of electors) were received which is a great outcome, given that voting in the Local Government Elections is not mandatory. The result is nearly double the participation of the State average.

Supplementary Election - Mayor

Council will hold a Supplementary Election in early 2023 to elect a Mayor for the District Council of Robe. The Electoral Commissioner has yet to advise Council regarding dates and the process for the Election. However, he has indicated that all supplementary elections should be held early in 2023. Once we receive further clarification, we will communicate with the community through the Community Newsletter, Website, Facebook Page and the Council Agendas.

Leader of the Opposition's Visit

On behalf of the community, it was a pleasure to host David Speirs MP, Leader of the Opposition, Nick McBride MP, Member for MacKillop, and Ryan Smith, the Leader's Chief of Staff. David specifically wanted a briefing on Council's Coastal Dynamics Project. Patrick Hesp and Charlotte Uphues from Flinders University also contributed to the briefing. Charlotte, with the support of Flinders University and Council, is undertaking a doctorate that is researching Robe's coastline.

The presentation covered the challenges we face in Robe with the coastline, what we have done to mitigate the challenges and an outline of the plan to roll out new monitoring equipment to allow us to take an evidence based approach. For example, a tidal gauge has been installed in Lake Butler Marina.



Buoys will be installed in December in Guichen Bay and the Southern Ocean to report on sea temperature, currents, wave heights and sand movement. Charlotte presented on the early modelling work she has done for Robe's coastline.

We also took our guests on a small tour so they could understand firsthand some of our challenges.

Non-Council Infrastructure Update

To keep the community informed, the following updates are provided for projects occurring in Robe but not undertaken by Council.

Firstly, under-grounding of powerlines on the Esplanade. We have been advised by SA Power Networks Network Project Manager that works will commence late January. Once we have a final date, we will notify the community via Facebook and our website.

Secondly, the Optus Tower on Morphett Street. I have been advised by Optus that there have been issues that have delayed the installation of the telecommunications tower. I will continue to liaise with their project manager and will keep the community informed when Council receives a firm timeline from Optus.

Expressions of Interest - Audit and Risk Management Committee Independent Member

District Council of Robe is seeking expressions of interest from suitably qualified people to become the independent Presiding Member of our Audit and Risk Management Committee (ARMC).

The primary objective of the District Council of Robe's ARMC is to protect and create value for Council and our community.

The ARMC is an advisory committee responsible for providing advice, assurance, oversight and recommendations to Council. ARMC contribute to a systematic and disciplined approach to evaluating and improving the effectiveness of financial management, risk management, internal controls, legislative compliance, and governance processes of Council. The ARMC consists of one independent member who is the Chair of the Committee and three Councillors.

Council is seeking applicants with strong communication skills, financial literacy, the capacity to form independent judgements and a willingness to constructively challenge and question. Experience on similar committees with relevant professional qualifications would be well regarded.

Applicants must demonstrate a functional knowledge in areas such as accounting, legal, governance, risk management, management control frameworks, fraud and corruption prevention, business operations, information communication and technology and cyber security.

Applicants must be able to attend meetings that are held at lease four times a year. Attendance need not be in person. Successful applicants will be paid for their attendance at meetings.

Flags

Council have received many 'comments' in regard to the position and arrangement of the flags on Royal Circus. Therefore, we thought it might be helpful to shed some light on the reasoning for the position of the flags.

According to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet's Australian Flag Booklet, if the flagpole is fitted with a gaff, the Australian National Flag should be flown from the peak of the gaff, which is the position of honor, even though the Australian National Flag is then lower than the flag flying from the masthead of the flagpole. This international tradition originates from the days of sailing ships, when it was necessary to keep the flag free from the ships rigging.

The next position of prominence is the masthead of the flagpole, then the left-hand side of the yardarm, then the right-hand side as viewed from the front of the flagpole/gaff combination.

Welcoming the Coral Adventurer

On Thursday the 24 November 2022, Robe welcomed the Coral Adventurer Cruise Ship and its passengers.

It was a wonderful relief to see this expedition ship successfully arrive and anchor in Guichen Bay, after a couple of previously failed attempts from much larger cruise ships in the past.

The ship left Cairns to circumnavigate Australia, and Robe was fortunate enough to be a destination roughly five weeks into their 60-day trip. Approximately 100 passengers arrived at the marina by tender boats where they were greeted by Council's Tourism employees to give them a brief introduction to the town, before they were left to discover Robe, either by walking or benefitting from the RSL bus which ferried them.



From feedback received from passengers before they boarded the ship, was that they had a wonderful time in Robe and they complimented the town on its friendly and helpful hospitality. The ship sailed off into the sunset, much heavier from their shopping sprees. The Product Development Manager for Coral Expeditions Cruise ship wanted us to thank all Robe residents and businesses for the lovely warm welcome they provided for their guests, and she told me – they will be back!

Public Consultation - Draft Lake Butler Marina Asset Management Plan

Pursuant to the Local Government Act 1999, Council is required to consult with the community on the Draft Lake Butler Marina Asset Management Plan.

Council, on behalf of the community, is custodian of many assets such as roads and buildings. To better manage these assets, Council has engaged specialists to review all assets, undertake condition assessments and value the assets. This will result in service standards for each asset class, evidence based maintenance plans and updated asset registers so we can properly account for and fund our assets into the future

There will be five asset management plans for the community:

- Buildings and Structure
- Open Space
- CWMS
- Lake Butler Marina
- Roads

At the special meeting held on 31 October, Council approved consultation on the Lake Butler Asset Management Plan. The Marina Advisory Committee has reviewed and provided feedback on the Management Plan. Therefore, it is now appropriate that the document is distributed for public consultation.

It is important to note that:

- this is the first asset management plan for the Marina;

- there were a number of assets that have not been captured in the asset register;
- the value of these assets have increased from approximately \$4 million to \$8.4 million
- based on the condition assessment, the process has provided the remaining useful life of each asset.

This is important as all assets will need to be replaced, often several times over the life of the current lease with the State Government (i.e., there is approximately 85 years remaining)

Once finalised, the information from the Asset Management Plan will be used to update our Long Term Financial Plans so the community has clear sight of the costs.

Short Term Dry Zone 2022-23


Over recent years, following consultation with South Australian Police (SAPOL), Council has put in place two Dry Zone Areas within the township of Robe to cover the weekend leading up to and including New Year's Eve to assist in moderating behaviour over the Christmas to New Year's Eve period.

The Dry Zone has proved successful in managing the behaviour of visitors to the town without having any adverse impact on the businesses within the town and visitors' enjoyment of the holiday period.

Council consult with SAPOL on the recommended Dry Zone period during the Christmas/New Year's holidays. This year, New Year's Eve will fall on a Saturday and therefore Council approved the period: 12 noon Friday 23 December 2022 until 12 Midnight Monday 2 January 2023.

The Dry Zone Areas will be appropriately advertised in advance of the Christmas to New Year's Eve period and appropriate signage will be installed to indicate the dry zones.

The Short Term Dry Zone application has been approved by the Consumer and Business Services and is scheduled to be gazetted in early December.

No Camping

A reminder that the District Council of Robe will continue to enforce its No Camping- By-Law 2 Local Government Land, Section 9.12 (No) 'Camping and Tents'. This means that camping on any Council land is prohibited and expiation's will be issued to offenders. The By-Law is defined as: A person must not without the permission of the Council, do any of the following on Local Government Land including Beaches, Parks, Reserves, Car parks:

- Erect a tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material, (including swags)
- Camp or sleep overnight: (unless in a caravan park)

ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to councilerobe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.





Friends of Little Dip Conservation Park (F.O.L.D.)

Who are we and what do we do?





The Friends of Little Dip Conservation Park is a group comprised of dedicated local volunteers who meet each Sunday at 3.00pm for 2 hours at the F.O.L.D nursery located at Flint Street, Robe.

Originally established in 1987 the group has operated for 35 years. During this time, the number of volunteers has fluctuated. Today, our group is made up of 55 dedicated volunteers who meet regularly to contribute their time and energy to our conservation efforts.

We are involved in a range of activities including seeding and propagating native vegetation, such as sheoak, large gum, dry land tea tree, native rosemary and cushion bush. The replanting of native vegetation within Little Dip and Lake St Clair Conservation Parks, walking track maintenance, campground maintenance along with beach clean ups. For F.O.L.D, beach clean ups are a regular activity because, unfortunately, an excess of rubbish and debris is inevitably being washed ashore on a regular basis.

These coastal environments provide an important habitat for native wildlife and marine life, including endangered and threatened species. Our volunteering efforts are geared towards protecting and allowing these ecosystems to thrive into the future. We are fortunate that our park rangers Emma and Cath provide their time and support.

If you enjoy the outdoors and our beautiful local environment and have free time available and can assist, please join us on Sunday afternoons at 3.00pm. A range of different tasks are carried out.
