Chief Executive Officer's Report

Community Connections

At the Wednesday 22 December Council Forum, the new Elected Members invited the following community groups to present to Council:

It was great to hear each group discuss their issues, opportunities and challenges. They provided an opportunity to understand firsthand the diverse views and expectations of the groups. There were proactive suggestions on how the groups and Council can work more closely together to build a stronger and more cohesive community.

These sessions are vital because as a small Council, we need to work together to provide a quality lifestyle and leisure activities for members of the community and for visitors to our District.

Robe's Coastal Monitoring Equipment

The Robe coastline is one of our most important assets. It is the reason many choose to live here and the reason that we have such a strong tourism sector. It is important that we understand this asset and manage it in the best way for future generations. Council's Coastal Dynamic Project is designed to provide data, information and knowledge to support decision making to ensure that any action we take to protect public and private assets on the coastline, don't create further issues.

The Project will provide much needed new data on bathymetry, waves, tides, currents, sea temperature and sea levels to understand the impacts of storms and events on historical and future nearshore, surfzone, beach, dune and cliff changes.

We are pleased to advise that the following equipment has been deployed to support the research:

- Tidal gauge at the Lake Butler Marina
- Bathymetry LiDAR (mapping the seabed) was taken on 20 December

- Two wave buoys, a sediment profiler and current meter were deployed in mid-December (see photos below)
- Appointment in July 2022 of a PhD student to utilise the data for research on the sustainable management of Robe's coastline.

A big thank you to Paul Regnier and his team who assisted with the deployment the equipment.

This project will significantly enhance the provision of a wide range of nearshore to coastal data for the region which is currently unavailable and contribute to state knowledge as there is very limited data and research in South Australia. It will significantly improve knowledge of why our coast is eroding, rates of change and impacts of storms and future climate change and sea level rise on the coastal system.

An outcome of the project will be models that will be shared to improve the collective knowledge in managing coastlines. Some of the benefits include:

- A consistent and coordinated approach to coastal adaptation planning
- Consistent and repeatable approach to coastal hazard data collection and monitoring
- Improved understanding of the risks and liabilities for South Australian communities related to coastal hazards in a changing climate
- Clarifying roles and responsibilities for adaptation including land use planning (both public and private assets), infrastructure planning and emergency management
- Increased resilience to extreme weather events through identification and mitigation of coastal risk exposures
- The collection, collation, and communication of reliable hazard data to support coordinated planning
- Capacity building programs to support local communities to determine, design and deliver solutions.

The District Council of Robe see this project as essential to being able to make informed decisions for the benefit of not only Robe, but also for the Limestone Coast Region and the state of South Australia. It will contribute to our understanding of the environment and our desire to manage and protect the coastline for future generations.

Council would like boat operators to be aware of the equipment and the importance of this project to our community. Therefore, to assist in not accidentally damaging the equipment, we provide the following information:

Offshore wave buoy: S 37°08.491' E 139°39.281' Inshore wave buoy: S 37°08.895' E 139°46.198'

Frame with sediment profiler and current meter: S 37°08.786' E 139°44.855'

Baseline anchoring of frame: S 37°08.491' E 139°44.829'

By not interfering with the equipment, we will be able to live stream the wave data online soon for all to see.

Delay in Establishing Diesel Fuel Facility at Depot

It is with deep regret that we inform the community and visitors to Robe that the project to establish a second diesel only fuel outlet at Council's Depot will be delayed. This is because Kain & Shelton (Agencies) Pty Ltd trading as K&S Fuels were unable to secure specialist providers that are required to allow the facility to operate.

Council has been working proactively with K&S Fuels, who formally leased the Caltex site and supply Robe Auto and Marine, to find a solution to ensuring the community and visitors can be serviced through the peak season. However, K&S Fuels did advise Council that their project to establish the new outlet was on a very tight timeline. The delay will mean that the new outlet will not be open until January 2023.

In terms of the project to date, K&S Fuels have installed a 78,000 litre bunded bulk fuel storage tank within Council's Depot. The storage tank will be used to not only deliver diesel to the public bowsers but also provide diesel to Council plant and equipment. The bowsers are secured in Council's Depot and will be installed once new concrete has been laid.





Council would like to thank the local contractors who have proactively worked on this project with the intent of an early delivery. Every endeavour has been undertaken to deliver the project before Christmas.

We would like to ask residence and visitors to be patient over the Christmas New Year period and we look forward to opening the new facility in early 2023.

Christmas Parade

The 2022 Robe Christmas Parade was another great success with a large number of participants, with Council employees happy to contribute. I would like to thank Tracey Bainger for once again organising this wonderful event.

Dry Zone

Over recent years, following consultation with South Australian Police (SAPOL), Council has put in place two Dry Zone Areas within the township of Robe to cover the weekend leading up to and including New Year's Eve to assist in moderating behaviour over the Christmas to New Year's Eve period.


The Dry Zone has proved successful in managing the behaviour of visitors to the town without having any adverse impact on the businesses within the town and visitors' enjoyment of the holiday period.

Council reached out to SAPOL to seek their approval for the recommended Dry Zone period during the Christmas/New Year's holidays. This year, New Year's Eve will fall on a Saturday and therefore the Elected Members approved the period:

12 noon Friday 23 December 2022 until 12 Midnight Monday 2 January 2023.

Council have installed appropriate signs to indicate the dry zones. (See maps for the two zones below)

The Short-Term Dry Zone application has been approved by the Consumer and Business Services and has been published in the Gazette.

The By-Law is defined as: A person must not without the permission of the Council, do any of the following on Local Government Land including Beaches, Parks, Reserves, Car parks:

Erect a tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material, (including swags) Camp or sleep overnight: (unless in a caravan park)

Beach Exclusion Zones

At the December 2022 Council Meeting, Elected members approved the declaration of the PWC exclusion zone for 15 December 2022 through to 31 January 2023 from the old slip way, including Town Beach to 1km North of Steve Woolston Road (3rd Ramp), 200m seaward of the low water mark.

No beach launching is permitted within the PWC zone. Vessels can be launched at the Boat Ramp or 1km North of 3rd Ramp.

Council hopes that the Beach Activity Zones and the enforcement of the no camping by-law will assist in making the town and it's beaches an even friendlier and safer place to be and we thank the Robe Community and is visitors in advance for their cooperation.

Find Your Bushfire Safer place

A Bushfire Safer Place is an area that has been designated as a place of relative safety, such as metropolitan Adelaide and some regional townships. These places have been assessed as safer from the affects of bushfires because:

- It is an area of low levels of bushfire fuel
- It is far enough from continuous bushland or forest to reduce the risk of sparks and embers
- The bushfire will be interrupted by; established gardens and lawns, and road networks and other low fuel areas
- There is likely to be access to emergancy health and other community services.

On high fire risk days, a Bushfire Safer Place may be used as a place:

- For people to stay in, if they already live in a Bushfire Safer Place
- To leave early to from high bushfire risk areas.

Community Wastewater Management Scheme - Desludging of Septic tanks


As part of the operating and maintenance of Council's Community Wastewater Management System (CWMS), Council provides a septic tank desludging program to properties within the Robe township that are connected to the CWMS.

To prevent sludge passing into council's drains our contractor, Envirogen Industrial Services attend each property on a four year cycle to remove accumulated sludge from the tanks. This work is done as an ongoing maintenance program, not as an emergancy call out for plumbing blockages. The next sector do be desludged is sector 3, letters have been sent to ratepayers who will be effected. Envirogen Industrial Services will notify rate payers as to when they are required to expose the septic tank. If you fail to expose the tank lid, there will be additional charges.

Are you thinking of building, landscaping, paving or constructing a driveway? It is critical to find out where your tank is and include this in your plan as adequate access to the lid of the tank (not the inspection point) is a must for maintenance and pumping. Construction on or near your septic system could damage the tank, pipes or soil.

Properties that are not connected to the CWMS, which dispose of their effluent to an on - site soakage drain still need to be desludged routinely at the owners expense.

- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.


