CEO's Report

Changes to the Community Newsletter

Council in an effort to improve its ability to consult with and communicate with all of its ratepayers and community members will be making some minor changes to the manner in which the Community Newsletter will be made available and its distribution.

Council acknowledges that the current community newsletter does not engage with the 67% of Council ratepayers that do not permanently reside in the Council area nor its rural community who don't automatically receive a copy of the Community Newsletter.

It is also acknowledged that the current delivery of the newsletter, thrown on the front lawn as the waste bin is collected is not an ideal way of distributing the Community Newsletter.

Commencing in December 2018, the following changes will take place:

- A Council Newsletter will be produced 4 times a year and posted to all ratepayers in July, September, December and March. This document will only contain Council information, it will not contain community notices and local business advertising. This document will be posted to every ratepayer.
- The Community Newsletter in its current format will be produced the other eight months of the year and will no longer be thrown out as the waste is collected but will be placed in every Post Office box in Robe, and will be available at the Council office, Library and Medical Centre.
- Both documents will be available on Council's website and if you have provided Council with your email address, will be emailed to you.
- The Community newsletter will no longer be posted out to anyone. If you currently receive the newsletter via post, please provide your email address to the Council office to receive the newsletter electronically.

Council have written to all the local businesses and community groups who advertise in the Community Newsletter advising them of the changes. Council believe that these changes will assist Council in improving its engagement with all members of its community. Fox Beach/Hooper's Beach – Protection of the Beach and Dunes

I was great to see the number of interested people who turned out for the presentation in relation to the protection of the dunes and beaches at Hooper's Beach and Fox Beach.

Bushfire Season

The start of a new bushfire season is nearly upon us and it is time to start thinking of what we need to do to prepare. While fires are inevitable, they are also survivable. Whether you choose to leave early to go to a safer place or to stay and defend your well prepared home, planning and preparation is the key to survival. Preparing yourself, your family and your home is your responsibility. The more you prepare your home the better the chances are that it will survive a bushfire, even if you plan to leave well before a bushfire starts. Preparing is not just about property and plans it is also about considering your physical, mental and emotional preparedness. A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bushfire than one that hasn't.

As a component of this, Council will again be conducting house and block inspections in and around Robe in the first week of November 2018. Council urges you to be Bushfire Ready by developing a Bushfire Action Plan and preparing your property for the impending bushfire season. Major Capital Projects Update

Redevelopment of the War Memorial

Council has been undertaking the redevelopment of the war memorial in recognition of the centenary of the First World War. The new Council will need to consider any future work at the memorial in addition to what has already been completed as part of the development of the 2019-2020 Annual Business Plan and Budget.

Robe Institute

Council have received the architects report on the work that needs to be done at the Robe Institute to repair existing water damage and prevent further damage to the building.

Council will be:

- Relocating the irrigation away from the external walls of the building,
- Installing gutter guards of the external gutters of the building,
- Installing a path around the external wall of the building which will drain water away from the building,
- Install underfloor ventilation, and
- Remove the plaster at the Kathleen Brown Room to allow the room to completely dry out.

Medical Centre Upgrade

Work is progressing with the redevelopment of the Medical Centre with an anticipated completion date being the middle of November.

Entrance to Customs House

A new entrance to the Customs House has been constructed which will make it easier for people to access the Customs house and remove Councils exposure to risk from falls and trips which has occurred in recent years.

Dairy Range Road Reconstruction

This project is proceeding and is expected to be completed before the holiday season.

Raising Road Rubble

Council has raised 15,000m³ at the Greenways pit.

This material will be used as part of Councils rural road reconstruction program.

Upgrade Community Water Treatment Lagoon

The contract for the upgrade of the treatment lagoon has been let. The first stage of this project is the drainage of the lagoon with the treated water being pumped onto the new golf course development to assist the Golf Club with the construction of the new six golf holes.

Robe Street Carpark

Paving has been completed.

Robe Cemetery – New Plinth

A new plinth is be constructed in the lawn section of the cemetery to ensure that Council is able to continue to provide facilities within this section of the cemetery.

Foreshore Main Beach

The irrigation gas been reconstructed and new grass sown.

The completion of the access ramp will occur in November, weather permitting.

Notice of Intent to Fox Bait in SE Coastal Parks and Reserves

The Department for Environment and Water wishes to advise you of the continuation of our fox baiting activities in several South East Coastal National Parks and Reserves. This notice applies through to June 2019. The fox baiting program involves the regular laying of semi-dried meat balls injected with 1080 poison as part of a fox control program to enhance biodiversity conservation by reducing the impacts of fox predation of native fauna.

The following parks will be baited either aerially and/or by vehicle along tracks, boundaries and some beaches within the following reserves: Canunda National Park, Coorong National Park (Younghusband Peninsula), Beachport Conservation Park, Little Dip Conservation Park and Piccaninnie Ponds Conservation Park.

Baits will be laid aerially in the Coorong National Park and Canunda National Park in November 2018 and March 2019. Vehicle-based baiting will occur in all parks listed above during November-December 2018 and March-April 2019.

This is a continuation of our non-retrieval baiting program and baits will be left in the field to prolong availability to foxes. Baits remain active for some time and it should be assumed that there could always be active 1080 fox baits within the park boundaries.

1080 baits are lethal to dogs and extreme caution must be taken with dogs in areas adjacent to park boundaries. Dogs are prohibited in NPWSA parks and reserves and it is pet owners responsibility to ensure that pets do not enter these areas. Landholders adjacent to these reserves should take particular care to ensure pets or working dogs do not roam into the National Parks and Reserves.






