Mayor's Report

This has been a busy month with many of our ratepayers contacting Elected Members on a range of issues. This is really appreciated by us all as we endeavour to work through the issues which affect our Council area.

Many phone calls have pertained to our unsealed roads. I ask that everyone is patient as we implement a more structured and thorough method of managing the road network. Patrol grading will still occur, but the focus is rebuilding the roads so that they will not require constant attention which in the end, will mean significant savings for our ratepayers.

The leases with Robe Bowling Club and Robe Golf Club are out for public consultation at the moment. Everyone will be receiving a letter from Council providing the details on the Robe Golf Club – District Council of Robe proposed land exchange. There are further details in this newsletter, but each ratepayer will receive a letter directly as it is so important that we get this decision right for our community.

The Robe 2050 survey is closing on Sunday 7 August. The results will assist with Council's planning into the future so please get online or get a hard copy from the Council office if you haven't had a chance to do the survey yet.

The Lions Club have recently given the Beacon Hill Lookout a face lift. Thank you to all the members for their work and commitment to our community. It is appreciated.

The Council elections are looming fast. There are two candidate briefing sessions to be held in the Council chambers in August (the 9th at 2pm and the 17th at 6pm) for anyone who is interested in nominating to be an Elected Member. Or alternatively, contact an Elected Member to discuss what is involved.

I am doing Coffee with the Mayor on 2 August at the Adventurous Spoon. There are still some places available so if you would like to discuss anything regarding any Council issues, please book in through the Executive Assistant on 8768 2003.

I would like to say upfront that it is not my intention to nominate again for the Mayoral position. Bradley and I have recently expanded our business and I am finding the time commitment of both roles too much to manage effectively.

NAIDOC Ceremony

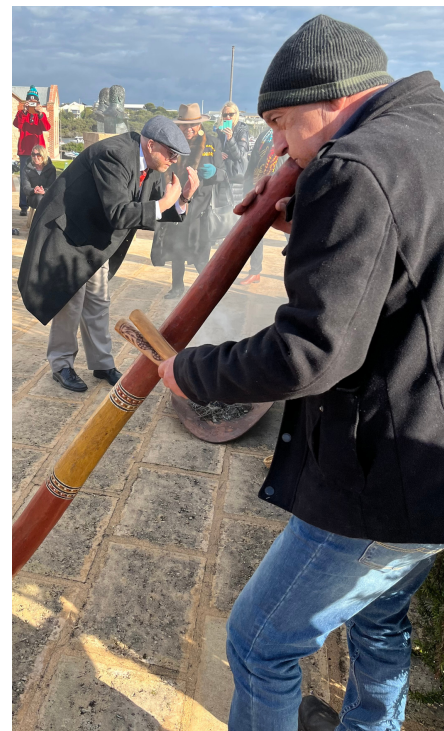

Golf Club Land Swap

The District Council of Robe is currently undertaking Public Consultation regarding the sale and purchase of land.

The proposed land for sale is community owned non-residential land which is currently leased by Robe Golf Club Inc (Robe Golf Club), which contains a section of the existing golf course. The purchaser is the Robe Golf Club. Council is proposing to purchase a parcel of residential land from the Robe Golf Club; this land adjoins a current parcel of land owned by Council that contains the Casuarina Lodge units in Hateley Crescent, Robe.

Following the outcome of Public Consultation and should Council approve the sale and purchase, the transaction would provide the following benefits:

- The Robe Golf Club would own all the land on which they currently operate the Golf course and will have secure tenure into the future.
- Council on behalf of our community, would gain additional residential land adjoining the land currently owned behind the Casuarina Lodge units in Hateley Crescent, Robe.
- The extra land combined with existing land would provide our community with sufficient land to consider future opportunities such as retirement living or any other future need.

Council has prepared a Proposal For Consideration of Revocation of Community Land – Robe Golf Club, to assist community in understanding the proposed exchange. The paper is available on Council's website and in hardcopy from the Council Office. Council is also posting a letter and a copy of the Proposal to all ratepayers.

Council will also be holding a public meeting at the Robe Institute on Tuesday 16 August commencing at 6:00pm to hear the views of the community and to address any questions. Representatives from the Robe Golf Club will also attend and be available to answer questions.

Community Consultation is a key component of how Councils make informed decisions. This letter is to encourage you to consider and share whether you are for or against this proposal. Please read the Proposal and provide a response, whether you are in favour of, or against the proposals it is important we receive your view. We are seeking your view on:

1. Revocation of community land classification; and
2. The sale of the land to the Robe Golf Club.

A report will be prepared for Council with a copy of all submissions received. Following consideration of these submissions, Council may resolve to submit this proposal, together with a report on all submissions made on it to the Minister for Local Government in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1999.

Remember cat registration is **FREE**, and having your cat in the Dogs and Cats system ensures they can be reunited to you easily if found.

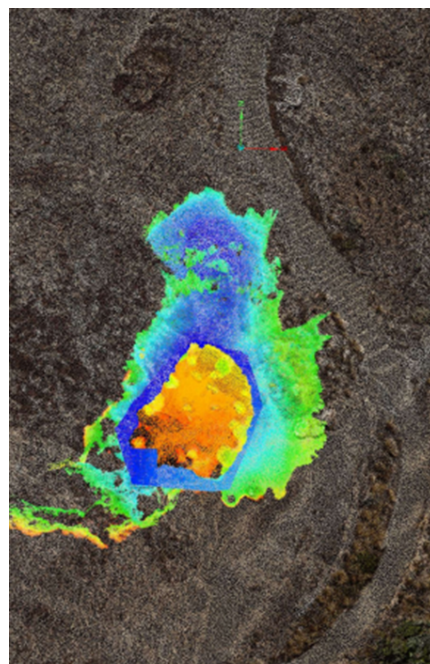
Blow Hole

Please note that the Woe hole has grown, with the eastern edge of the hole collapsing further towards the path. This is an unstable and dangerous area with the hole being larger than it appears at the surface and will continue to expand without warning.



The area that has recently broken off would be the light blue to the east of the Woe Hole.

The District Council of Robe have placed additional signage and bunting in the area, please do not cross this barrier. There are undercuts up to 4 meters from the opening, please abide by the signage and do not enter restricted areas.

Elections

The Local Government Election will be held in November 2022 but there are several steps that need to occur before the election. We have already passed one milestone with the Voting Supplementary Roll closing on Friday 29 July 2022.

There are still other key dates to mark in your calendar including

- Nominations Open Tuesday 23 August 2022
- Nominations Close 12 noon Tuesday 6 September 2022
- Dispatch of Ballot Material/Voting packs – Between Friday 14 October and Thursday 20 October
- Close of Voting 5pm Thursday 10 November 2022
- Scrutiny and Count 9am Saturday 12 November 2022

There are three phases of the Council Elections:

Phase 1: Enrol - Complete

Phase 2: Nominate

Phase 3: Vote

Nominate

Councils are part of your everyday, they provide roads and footpaths, parks and playgrounds, libraries, sporting facilities and much more.

The decisions about these services and facilities are made by an elected group of councillors.

Becoming a Councillor gives you the chance to shape your local community as part the council team. It is a rewarding challenge - one that requires passion and leadership. It involves a commitment and a responsibility in upholding the law and giving your community confidence in local government.

Local government performs best when members of council are representative of their community. That means having different backgrounds, experiences, culture, age and gender.

There are many people in our local community who can provide strong leadership for councils. If you care about the future of your community, you can nominate for council. Becoming a councillor is one of the most direct ways that you can influence decisions that affect the quality of life in your local area.

Council will be running Candidate Briefing Sessions for people interested in nominating for Council. These sessions will be an opportunity for you to come along and learn about the role and what it takes to be a Councillor. The planed dates are:

- **Tuesday 9 August 2022 - 2.00pm to 3.30pm**
- **Wednesday 17 August 2022 - 6.00pm to 7.30pm**

Both sessions will have a Zoom option available.

Eligibility to Nominate:

It is very likely you are eligible. In fact, the majority of people who vote in local elections are also eligible to run as a candidate.

To nominate you must be:

- an Australian citizen
- eligible to vote in your area
 - or are an officer of a body corporate nominated to vote
 - or are a member and nominee of a group that is on the council voters roll for the area.

You cannot run for council if you are:

- a state or federal member of parliament
- bankrupt or receiving relief of insolvent debt
- disqualified from holding office by a court order
- a council employee of that area
- a candidate for election in another council
- a person in prison or sentenced to prison.

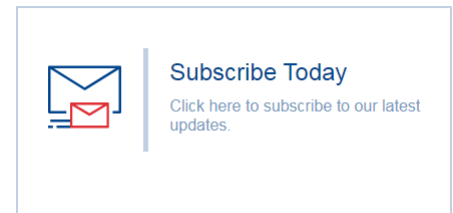

MYLOCAL SERVICES APP

MyLocal Services is a mobile phone app that allows you to report a problem within the Council area, receive notifications about waste collection days and check Waste Transfer Station opening times. The app is designed to make it more convenient to find Council information 24/7.

You'll never forget bin day again!

You can also find places 'Near Me' such as parks and playgrounds.

We encourage all residents and ratepayers to download the App. It is very easy to use, and the details are specific to your house location. MyLocal Services App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to council@robe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.
