

Mayor Riseley's Report

China Ban Recyclables

As a result of the decision by China to impose restrictions on the import of recyclables, communities across Australia will be faced with big decisions. Foremost, increased costs to communities and ratepayers will occur.

Systems and reuse purposes will take some time to develop.

Already Australian companies are adapting waste material in new and unique ways finding opportunities to utilise waste as a source of raw materials.

One company is grinding waste glass to form sand suitable for road base and another grinding tyres into additive for asphalt.

For Robe, ratepayers costs associated with handling recyclables will rise in the order of up to 9%. To curtail these rises the most important measures our community can make are:

1. Take bottles and cans to the recycle depot (Flint Street, Robe), and
2. Avoid contamination, ensure you put things in the correct bin.

Foreshore Fence

The May Council agenda contained an extensive report from the Chief Executive, Roger Sweetman on the foreshore fence. Council's insurers the LG Mutual Liability Scheme are sending a scheme manager to meet with Elected Members to ensure complete understanding of requirements and responsibility.

It is apparent a fence is required and the options are limited, the area is sensitive for many reasons, views, heritage and risks.

I have asked Chief Executive, Roger Sweetman to seek advice on Robe Council having a Referendum about the fence with this year's election.

It is evident that any litigation that did result from a major accident would impact the ratepayers of Robe. As such, it is the ratepayers of Robe who should make the decision.

REGIONAL RESIDENTS IMploRED TO CHOOSE SAFETY AS ROAD TOLL CLIMBS

The Australian Road Safety Foundation (ARSF) is imploring regional South Australians to choose road safety, with reports that 8 in 10 of the state's fatalities this year have occurred on rural roads.

Despite only making up 30 per cent of the population, regional and rural areas account for 80 per cent of fatal road trauma across South Australia.

To help prevent further unnecessary loss of life, the ARSF is joining forces with local community groups ahead of Fatality Free Friday next week (25 May).

Teaming up with Limestone Coast Local Government Association and countryfooty.com.au, the ARSF is urging regional South Australians to choose road safety by making a Fatality Free Friday pledge online, or at one of the local community events.

In the lead up to Fatality Free Friday, the ARSF has also released new research, which shows that 93 per cent of the state's drivers agree that road crashes are the result of bad choices and believe more should be done to save lives.

However, it is not the authorities that the local community is calling on to stop this tragic and unnecessary loss of life – it's each other, everyday road users who have the power to save lives.

In fact, 48 per cent of South Australian drivers went so far to say that they were fed up with people breaking the law and want to see them off the roads.

ARSF founder and CEO Russell White said that the significant figures reflect a sentiment shift as the local community becomes further aware that many fatal and serious crashes are a result of choice.

"The reality is that more often than not, the tragic loss of life on our roads is because of someone's choice – the choice to speed or to use a mobile phone, the choice to drive under the influence of drugs or alcohol, the choice not wear a seatbelt or run a red light," said Mr White.

"These are split second decisions that many people make all the time, but sometimes the consequences are fatal. And with every life lost, there are countless friends and family who will forever carry the heartache of losing someone close to them."

Alarminglly, the research showed that the majority of South Australians are unaware of how serious an issue road safety is across the state.

When asked how many people they believed were killed on the roads each year, 4 in 5 were more than 200 deaths away from the average road toll figure. Frighteningly, 21 per cent thought it was only one third of the actual number of lives lost, a further 30 per cent thought it was only two thirds of the true figure.

Mr White said this lack of understanding of how frequent fatal crashes are on South Australian regional roads was likely to be a factor in why so many continue to make dangerous decisions on the road.

"What the new research showed is that the majority of drivers don't understand how common it is for poor decisions to cause a crash, and that fuels an 'it won't happen to me' mentality," he said.

"Our research also indicated that South Australia was home to the most dangerous drivers, with three quarters of the state admitting to dangerous driving acts"

The South Australian data has been released as the ARSF calls on the state's regional residents to support its annual Fatality Free Friday initiative, which imploroes road users to make a pledge to choose road safety.

Held annually on the last Friday in May since its inception in 2007, Fatality Free Friday has garnered support from hundreds of thousands of Australian drivers, who have taken the road safety pledge, either in person, at one of the many public signing events across the country, or online.

What you need to know

New laws for cat and dog owners and breeders will soon be introduced in South Australia. These changes are designed to improve dog and cat management and welfare and are the result of years of planning and public consultation.

Microchipping and desexing – it's compulsory

From 1 July 2018, it will be compulsory for:

- All dogs and cats over a certain age to be microchipped
- All new generations of dogs and cats (born after 1 July 2018) to be desexed *exemptions apply for working dogs, registered breeders etc*

These changes are designed to increase the likelihood of lost or impounded dogs and cats being reunited with their owners, and reduce the number of unwanted and abandoned litters euthanised in pounds and shelters.

Discount Microchipping

While the new desexing requirement only affects dogs and cats born after 1 July 2018, all dogs and cats must be microchipped by this date.

Microchipping is a safe and permanent way to identify your dog and cat. The procedure is quick, with no ongoing discomfort and can only be carried out by a trained, authorised implanter. Discount microchipping days are offered throughout the state at various times of the year. Visit dogandcatboard.com.au or chipblitz.com.au for more details.

New rules for Breeders and Sellers

There are also new rules for breeders and sellers, including:

- From July 1, 2018, breeders and sellers who breed dogs and cats for sale must be registered with the Dog and Cat Management Board as a breeder.
- Breeders and sellers must now adhere to new industry standards and guidelines, which stipulate the minimum welfare conditions that must be met to comply with the state's animal welfare laws. For more information, visit the animal welfare section of environment.sa.gov.au
- A new requirement for dog and cat sellers to provide certain information in advertisements and to the buyer.

DACO – a new way to register your dog or cat

From 1 July 2018, a dog and cat registration, along with the way you manage your pet dog or cat's microchip, health and breeder information, will be simplified with the introduction of a new website.

Dogs and Cats Online (DACO) will be the central point for all your dog and cat management payments and information, replacing the 68 individual council systems and private microchip databases currently in place.

Not only will DACO simplify your dog or cat management needs, but it will streamline the process for councils, vets and animal welfare agencies too, giving these organisations instant access to information from around the state. This will help them reunite you and your lost dog or cat quicker.

Changes to dog registration categories

As of 2017, dog registration in South Australia has been simplified. Your dog now falls under one of these two simple categories. These changes have been made to streamline registration categories throughout the state.

Standard dog: a dog that is both desexed and microchipped

Non-standard dog: all other dogs, even if they are exempt from the rules around desexing or microchipping, such as dogs belonging to registered breeders, working livestock dogs etc.
