Whales in the Bay

Robe has been blessed by the visit of two Southern Right Whales with calves. The visit has been over a period of six weeks, more like nursery ground behaviour rather than a quick shelter.

Given the right conditions, this could happen again in future seasons if the conditions suit. For this to happen the whales have certain specific requirements, namely they must be given safety comfort. There have been reports of both boats and jet ski's in close proximity, which resulted in disturbance and the whales moving out of the bay.

Council has made contact with the Department of Water and Natural Resources (DENWR), as a result, signage has been placed at the boat ramp and at the Long Beach second ramp entrance advising of the clearance requirements pertaining to whales and calves.

National Parks and Wildlife (Protected Marine Mammals Regulations 2010)

With respect to the clearance distances, there is considerable detail in the Act; basically boats and jet skis should not be closer than 100 metres to an adult whale and no closer than 300 metres to a calf, with a speed not exceeding 4 knots.

Aircraft, including gyrocopters and helicopters, should observe a clearance distance by perimeter of 500 metres and not be below 500 metres in height while in proximity of whales.

There are serious fines if convicted of breaching Marine Mammal Regulations.

Australia Day Awards 2017

Citizen of the Year: To be eligible, the person must be an Australian Citizen.

Community Event of the Year: Presented to the person(s)/group who has staged the most outstanding community event during the year.

From the Director of Childcare

Like other Children's Services across Australia, CCOWS is working through a transition process towards a new Funding System proposed by the Australian Government. There is a Bill before Federal Parliament at the moment which recommends a change in funding to a "Subsidy System". Each child will be subsidised for the hours of care which they attend, and the amount of subsidy will depend on the earning capacity of their parents, and how many hours a week those parents work. The subsidy will be paid to the Child Care Service and parents will be required to pay the "Gap". The "Gap" is the difference between the subsidy received from the Government and the actual operating cost to deliver the service per day. Negotiations and advocacy is ongoing to ensure that a reasonable subsidy and funding system is passed, to enable the continued provision of children's services to children in rural and regional areas. CCOWS is working with all factions of Government to make certain that they appreciate the need for child care in this community, the benefit it has for families and children, and to make them aware of the challenges services face in delivering consistent caring and education experiences for the children at CCOWS. As always we "do the best we can with what we have, where we are."

Chief Executive's Report

Dry Zone New Year's Eve

A reminder to everyone that Robe will be a Dry Zone again for New Year's Eve, meaning that alcohol cannot be consumed in a public place between the hours of 12 noon New Year's Eve (Saturday 31st of December 2016) until 12 noon New Year's Day (Sunday 1st of January 2017).

The introduction of this zone has greatly assisted with the management of antisocial behaviour and enables Robe to be enjoyed by everyone during the New Year's Eve celebrations.

Fireworks New Year's Eve

Weather permitting, unless a total fire ban has been declared, there will be a fireworks display at the Robe Foreshore on New Year's Eve between 9.30pm and 10.00pm.

Local Heritage and Character Position Paper

As part of a significant program of reform of South Australia's planning system, in August 2016 the Minister for Planning released a Local Heritage Discussion Paper for public consultation. The Discussion Paper identifies opportunities for reform around processes for identifying and managing local heritage through the *Planning Development and Infrastructure Act 2016* (the PDI Act) and non-legislative mechanisms.

The Local Government Association of South Australia (LGA) has developed a position paper in response to this call for consultation which is supported by Council. A copy of the position paper is available on the Council website.

Upgrade Public Toilets – Town Beach

Council has engaged Tim Rogers Environmental and Architectural Design to undertake a survey of the existing toilets and prepare a plan for the upgrade of the toilets.

These plans, when completed, will be presented to Council for consideration seeking approval to move to the next stage of the project which will be calling for tenders.

Environmental Health Annual Report 2015-2016 Financial Year

Available on Council's website is the District Council of Robe, Environmental Health Annual Report 2015-2016 Financial Year.

Road Side Tree Planting

Council have undertaken roadside tree planting at the Kingston Road, Clay Wells Road intersection and Squires Drive and will commence the replacement of the trees within the Main Street within the next few weeks.

The staff have only planted the number of trees that can be easily looked after during the summer months to ensure that they survive and it is expected that this number of trees would be again planted next year.

2016/2017 Bushfire Season

The start of a new bushfire season is nearly upon us and it is time to start thinking of what we need to do to prepare. While fires are inevitable, they are also survivable. Whether you choose to leave early to go to a safer place or to stay and defend your well prepared home, planning and preparation is the key to survival. Preparing yourself, your family and your home is your responsibility. The more you prepare your home the better the chances are that it will survive a bushfire, even if you plan to leave well before a bushfire starts. Preparing is not just about property and plans it is also about considering your physical, mental and emotional preparedness. A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bushfire than one that hasn't.

As a component of this, Council will again be conducting house and block inspections in and around Robe in the first week of November 2016. Council urges you to be Bushfire Ready by developing a Bushfire Action Plan and preparing your property for the impending bushfire season. Burning in the Robe Township

The *Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016* (the Policy) came into effect on 23 July 2016.

The Policy was created by the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) following a consultation period in late 2015 and early 2016 to consolidate a number of existing policies and guidelines with the intent of better protecting and improving the health of South Australians and our environment through improved air quality. The Policy regulates air emissions including those from wood heaters and burning in the open.

Wood Heaters

- The Policy includes rules regulating the sale and installation of wood heaters to target health impacts associated with smoke from wood heaters.
 - The Policy requires compliance with various Australian Standards for the sale and installation of all wood heaters, ensuring that wood heaters are engineered to operate efficiently, decreasing emissions to the atmosphere.
 - The Policy requires firewood retailers do not sell domestic firewood with a moisture content of greater than 25% (dry weight) to protect the community against excessive smoke from burning of inappropriate fuel.
- There is also a requirement that the owner of a solid fuel heater does not allow excessive smoke to be generated from the heater.

Burning in the Open

A number of changes are now in place in relation to burning in the open following the introduction of the Policy including bushfire hazard reduction, disposal of agricultural and forestry waste and backyard burning in townships.

Notable Changes

- Under the Policy, property owners within Townships (Robe township) require approval from the Council to undertake burning for bushfire hazard reduction and for disposal of agricultural and forestry waste.
 - Burning in townships that previously occurred Monday to Saturday, 10am to 3pm, is no longer allowed.
 - Inside the Robe township, only charcoal can be used in a brazier, chiminea or fire pit for heating an outdoor area. No other fuels are permitted.
- Fires for recreational purposes within the Robe township, including camp fires, are not allowed.

Next Steps – Burning in the Robe Township

The introduction of the Air Quality Policy results in a number of changes to controls relating to burning in the open. In regards to the Robe township, the burning that was previously permitted without the requirement for any approval, Monday to Saturday, 10am to 3pm, **now requires a burning permit from Council.**

The District Council of Robe has developed a Township Burning Permit Policy to establish a set of criteria to be considered by Council's delegated officers when assessing permit applications for burning within the Robe township.

A Burning Permit will be required to carry out one or more of the following burning activities outside of a fire danger season:

- burning agriculture or forestry waste; or
- burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control; or
- burning vegetation for any other purpose.

In assessing Burning Permit applications, Council's Authorised Officers, will use their discretion, taking into account the following criteria, in determining whether a permit will be issued or not:

- Bushfire risk of the area
- Purpose of the proposed burning
- Amount of material to be burnt
- Fuel load present on adjoining properties
- Properties in close proximity or adjoining reserves or national parks
- Proximity and potential impact to neighbouring residents
- Availability of other reasonable means to dispose of the vegetation
- Legitimacy of the proposed burning – i.e. is this genuine fire hazard reduction or rubbish removal
- Nature of material to be burnt
- Size of the Allotment
- Terrain of the allotment and locality
- Accessibility to the allotment and area where the vegetation is to be burnt
- Is the material declared and or woody weeds
- Is the material diseased plant material
- Requirements of the Country Fire Service Broad Acre Burning Code of Practice
- Requirements of the Country Fire Service Vegetation Pile Burning Code of Practice
- Religious or Cultural purposes

The **Application for Permit for Burning in the Open** will be required to be completed and sent to the Council office to enable a Council Authorised Officer to assess an application for burning in the open. The Council Authorised Officer will then determine if a Burning Permit will be issued and any conditions that will apply. Policy 2.32 'Township Burning Permit Policy' can be viewed on the website and the application can be obtained from the Council office or from the Council website.

There are currently eight internet service providers available, all with retail plans at different price points and data allowances, so you can choose a plan that best suits your needs. EasyPark Pay-by-Phone at the Robe boat ramp

Robe Council now offers EasyPark Pay by Phone for daily and weekly boat launching fees at the Robe boat ramp. Registering for the service is quick and can be completed in the Smartphone App <http://app.easypark.net>, on the EasyPark website or by calling the EasyPark customer service team on 1300 734 070. Once registered you can use the EasyPark Smartphone App or call the service number to comfortably pay your boat launching fees.

EasyPark bills the parking fees to your credit or debit card. Paying your boat launching fees by phone is quick and simple – enter the 4 digit code for the appropriate boat launching fee, enter your rego number and away you go.

Advantages of using the service:

- No coins, no hassle.
- Use anytime.
- Daily permits valid for 24hrs and Weekly permits for 7 days.
- Can pay before you come down to the ramp.
- Can opt to obtain emailed parking receipts of each transaction, this is also stored in the user's EasyPark account and on the EasyPark App.
- Also available at the Beachport boat ramp in coordination with Wattle Range Council.
