MAYOR'S REPORT & COUNCIL NEWS

Sand Management Town Beach

With beach levels at a low level similar to that of the 1980's, this winter's high seas have caused severe damage to the dune system along town beach.

Council, in collaboration with the Coast Protection Board are carrying out sand replenishment work and repairs to the groyne to aid sand retention.

Members of the public have been offering advice to the Council with their recommendations for remedy to the problem. The advice from the Coast & Marine Scientific Officers is that extending the sea wall would result in loss of town beach. Historic documentation shows that the removal of the dune system to create an esplanade in front of the Robe Hotel resulted in the threat of inundation and flooding due to storm surge. The Council of the day built a sea wall, which was

subsequently lost in storms of that winter. After much lobbying to the State Government the current, more substantial rock armour was placed and over time the beach lost. The dunes were removed in 1874 so the photo is from some time earlier. The Council of the time was advised not to remove the dunes and there was a resultant Parliamentary enquiry. The current Council will work with the relevant departments to formulate the most appropriate and cost effective solution to long term sand management.

COUNCIL PROPOSAL TO REZONE LAND AT DAVENPORT STREET

Council has recently received approval from the Minister for Planning for a Development Plan Amendment to rezone approximately 6ha of land owned by the Robe Golf Club from its present zoning of Open Space (Recreation Policy Area) to Residential. The land has a frontage of some 200 metres to Davenport Street with secondary road access via James and Elizabeth Streets. An aerial photo showing the land is provided below.

The land is generally flat and approximately half is occupied by fairways (holes 6 & 7) and the remainder is covered with native vegetation of varying quality. The land is adjoined by the Residential Zone to the south and east, Residential Character zone (Historic Conservation Area) to the north and Open Space zoned land accommodating the balance of the golf course to the west of the Davenport Street road alignment.

Under the current zoning controls a dwelling and land division are currently non-complying developments, although the Desired Character statement for the Recreation Policy Area recognises that; *“residential development may be appropriate in the future as part of an integrated redevelopment of the robe golf course, but in the interim will not be developed within the existing recreation area.”*

The affected land has been identified for residential expansion given its strategic position with respect to its proximity to the town centre and existing residential area, existing provision of infrastructure and the longer term recognition that, as land south of the property develops and Davenport Street becomes a more used local road, it would be inappropriate for golfers to have to cross the road.

The land has been assessed by expert horticulturalists to determine the extent and nature of the remnant native vegetation on the land, and the Department of Environment Water and Natural Resources have played a significant role in reviewing the investigations which have determined the extent of vegetation to be retained on the land. The Development Plan Amendment will include a concept plan to provide more detailed guidance for the future development of the property should it be rezoned.

The concept plan includes;

a reserve along the northern boundary of the land which will accommodate stormwater management and ponding infrastructure linking to the existing ponding basin on the western side of Davenport road. It will also provide a landscape buffer to the existing dwellings on the northern side of the land.

Possible road links between the land and Elizabeth and James Streets. Whether these links will be created will depend on how the land is ultimately developed and an assessment of the likely additional traffic to be generated. The road links are important for a number of reasons, namely to,

- allow the economic extension of existing infrastructure (power, water, sewer etc)
- provide pedestrian links,
 - allow Council rubbish trucks and service vehicles to economically service the area and not have to reverse or turn around on no through roads.

Retention of the highest quality vegetation on the land and its management by the Golf Club to control pests and weeds so as to maintain local biodiversity.

WHERE TO FROM HERE

Once Council have approved the DPA it will be placed on public consultation. The consultation process will involve;

- sending copies of the DPA to nominated Government Agencies,
- a notice in the Government Gazette,
- A notice in the Advertiser Newspaper,
- A notice in the Coastal Leader. A press release will also be provided to the Coastal Leader as part of the consultation process.


A copy of the DPA will be available to the public via a number of mediums, including as printed copies or electronic versions (CD) at the Council office and library, which will be available to review at the location or to purchase; and on the Council's web site. The Minister has approved concurrent agency and public consultation which is required over an 8 week period during which time members of the public may lodge written submissions. After the consultation period has ended a public meeting will be held (if required) at which any interested person may appear to make further representations on the proposed amendment. Council is required to make all submissions received available to the public between the close of the consultation period and the holding of the public meeting. If consultation is commenced later this month the consultation period will finish in mid-January 2014 with a public meeting also in mid-January coinciding with school holidays to give absent land owners the best opportunity to be heard. This would possibly allow the Council to consider the DPA at its meeting in early February. Residents are encouraged to view the DPA when it is on consultation and to provide comments to the Council on the proposed rezoning.

THE APPROVAL PROCESS

At the conclusion of the consultation period, the Council will be provided with copies of all the submissions, a summary of them together with a recommendation as how the various submissions could or should be addressed. If the Council resolves to approve the DPA (subject to any amendments that might arise as a result of the consultation process), the DPA is amended accordingly and the relevant documents are forwarded to the Department for approval by the Minister. This process can take 6 to 8 weeks.

Redevelopment of the Land based Infrastructure Lake Butler

Marina

Council have resolved to take advantage of a State Government Infrastructure Grant program to seek grants to complete improvements to the Lake Butler Marina entrance and associated infrastructure.

While the final plans for this project will not be finalized until discussions are held with the Fisherman's Association the project could include the following;

- Completion of Stage 1 of the project, new entrance, car parking, Fisherman's Memorial lighting etc,
- Removal of the hill within the hard stand,
- Paving the area of the hill,
- Construction of toilets
- Installation of security fencing
- Amenity improvements to the fuel tank, Stanke's building, take-away and weighing station,
- Improvements to the wharf to accommodate the cruise ship visits.

An initial estimate of the costs involved in the project is approx.

\$400,000.

Procedure for Informal Meetings of Elected members

Elected Member Forums

All informal meetings of Council referred to as Mayors Forums, Elected Member Forum or Working Group meetings shall have an agenda that includes;

- The time and place of the informal meeting ,
- The purpose of the informal meeting
- Signed by the Chief Executive or his/her delegate
- And shall contain the following introductory paragraph;

This meeting is an informal meeting of Council members and staff held pursuant to Section 90 subsection (8) of the Local Government Act 1999 for the purpose of;

- Informing the elected body of matters that may be presented to Council for consideration at upcoming Council meetings.
- Receiving presentations by third parties, consultants or staff on matters relevant to Council.
- Providing a forum for elected members to raise matters with staff that require research prior to presentation to future Council meetings.

The Public, unless specifically invited to attend, is excluded from these meetings.

Council cannot formally debate any matters under consideration at this meeting. The formal debate on the issues or subjects considered at this meeting must be undertaken at the formal monthly Council meeting.

Council cannot make any decisions on matters under consideration at this meeting as formal Council/Committee meetings are the only forums at which Council decisions can be made.

Items from Elected Members are welcome, please note that there will be time constraints and items will be addressed time permitting.

Elected Member Briefing/Training sessions

Council can hold such briefing sessions or training sessions as is required to keep the elected members informed of legislative and other changes affecting Local Government.

Elected members will be provided with sufficient notice of upcoming training/ briefing sessions and if appropriate records will be kept of Elected Members attendance at the sessions.

The Public, unless specifically invited to attend, is excluded from these meetings.

Council cannot formally debate any matters under consideration at this meeting. The formal debate on the issues or subjects considered at this meeting must be undertaken at the formal monthly Council meeting.

Council cannot make any decisions on matters under consideration at this meeting as formal Council/Committee meetings are the only forums at which Council decisions can be made.

Social gatherings

The Elected Members may hold and attend such social gatherings as is appropriate.

The public is neither specifically excluded nor included from attending social gatherings.

Council cannot formally debate any matters under consideration at these gatherings and Council cannot make any decisions on matters under consideration at these gatherings as formal Council/Committee meetings are the only forums at which Council decisions can be made.

Fire protection/Fire Prevention Lip Dip Conservation Park

The Mayor will be facilitating a meeting of the Government Departments and landowners who adjoin the Park to discuss issues relating to the fire prevention and fire protection issues that are associated with the Park during the summer months.

Stakeholders will be advised of the meeting date once arrangements have been finalized.

A new tourism website is currently under development to support tourism businesses across the Limestone Coast.

The Robe DC are supporting the production of a new tourism website to draw more visitors to the Limestone Coast and increase their length of stay.

Together with the Robe Business and Tourism Association, council are working with the website provider to ensure that Robe and its businesses have a strong presence on the site. The more information Robe businesses' can provide the visitor before they arrive, the longer they will stay, increasing economic activity across the region.

All tourism businesses have been provided the ability to generate micro-websites on the guide, showcasing their businesses and linking consumers directly to their own websites, online bookings and sales sites, and their social media sites such as TripAdvisor, Facebook and YouTube.

Council encourages our businesses to get involved, as tourists are moving away from print guides and instead looking for information on their mobile devices and Robe needs to be ready to support the new digital tourist.

The Limestone Coast website will be a sister program to similar sites supporting the McLaren Vale and the Barossa which have been serving those communities for more than three years. The McLaren Vale site can be viewed at www.mclarenvaleguide.info, and can be enjoyed on all smartphones and tablet devices irrespective of operating system.

The Limestone Coast guide will launch in early December 2013, just in time for the Xmas rush.



**FREE SKIN CANCER SCREENING 18th & 19th of
January 2014.**

The Robe Lions Club will be hosting two days of free Skin Cancer Screening during the Robe Boat Show in January 2014.

The Screening Team, consisting to two health professionals specialising in Skin Cancer and Lion Marilyn Miller, the Projects District Chairman, will conduct free screenings in the Robe CAFHS Building (situated alongside of the Council offices and only a short walk from the Boat Show.

Whilst Skin Cancer screening services are available in most major centres, they are not easily available to regional and remote regions of Australia AND they are not always based on Medicare rates making it an expensive exercise on occasion.

****Screeners do not provide any formal diagnosis or prognosis and a referral form is handed to a patient, if a lesion is detected indicates a problem area of the skin that requires further investigation by their nominated Medical Practitioner.****

Current statistics for this Lions Project show that almost 30% of people screened have been detected with skin damage requiring further investigation, with a number of those rated as possibly life threatening. The sooner a skin cancer is identified and treated, the better chance of appropriate surgery.
