Council's policy provides guidance to Council and its administration about how Council purchases goods and services.

There are occasions when Council for various reasons has to act outside its policy which it is entitled to do. In reviewing the policy, Council have added an additional clause to the policy that states that in those situations where Council resolves to act outside its policy, it must detail the reasons for doing so in the Council meeting minutes.

Guest speaker for the day was our pharmacist, An Tran, who passionately shared his life story and journey from Vietnam to Australia by boat.

Citizens of the Year, Peter and Susie Young received their award and Robe RSL and the ANZAC Day 2015 Memorabilia display received the Event of the Year award. The Mayoral awards followed this.

### CCOWS REPORT—*Important Beginnings*

At the beginning of the year at CCOWS there are many children joining us for the first time. It is the first time that many of them have been with a group of children. And so "the learning to be with others" begins. It is learning that will be with them in situations they meet, for the rest of their lives. I'm sure that most parents agree that one of the first things a child learns to say at child care is "stop". It reflects a child's ability to recognise that they have the power to settle things using words. They will also learn to identify their feelings....sad, cross, happy, bored, pleased. This ability helps them to recognise and regulate their emotions. Even at three years old, they can learn to recognise when they need to calm down, or walk away and have quiet time by themselves. Important beginnings for a useful skill for future negotiation and peaceful survival.

## **AN TRAN'S AUSTRALIA DAY ADDRESS 26/01/2016**

I would like to acknowledge the traditional owners and custodians of the beautiful land we are on today.

Good morning, family and friends. I feel so very humbled to be standing up here before you today and to say that I'm honoured for this opportunity would be a more than an understatement.

For those of you who don't know me, my name is An, I'm a pharmacist and I have had the pleasure of serving the lovely people of Robe for the past 2.5 years. First off, I would like to thank you for your time, and today I would like to share with you a little bit about my childhood and what Australia Day means to me.

Today is a very special day!

It has always been a special day for me and my family, because it is a day that we take a moment to reflect.

- To reflect how we became Australians and the sacrifices that we have made along the way.
- To reflect on how Australia has given us a second chance and opened its arms to us when we had nowhere to go.
- To reflect on what it means to be an Australian and how we can give back to the country that has given us so much.

I came to Australia in 1989 from a country, destroyed by conflict. My parents escaped Vietnam by boat after the war. I was too young to remember the entire journey but from what my parents have told me, we are very lucky to be here today.

There wasn't a day that went by where my parents wouldn't remind me how fortunate we are and how it is our responsibility and it is our duty to give back in some way shape or form.

Looking back at my childhood and upbringing now, I have come to realise that I was fortunate in more ways than one. Not only was I given the opportunity to be what I wanted to be, to be who I wanted to be. I was also lucky enough to live and experience firsthand the diversity and beauty of Australia and its people.

I started my schooling at Elizabeth Vale Primary School, which was situated in the northern suburbs of Adelaide. It was an area which has a particularly dense indigenous population. And the school itself heavily focused on indigenous culture. Some of my fondest memories were made here. I grew up learning traditional aboriginal songs and dance, learnt how to play traditional instruments, learnt about the respect for the land and listened to stories of the dream time. I really felt I tapped into the spirit of the land I now call home. Looking back now, I really couldn't have asked for a better start to my education than that.

A few years later, my family moved into a new neighbourhood, where many other ethnic families resided. I studied and grew up with children who came from all around the world. Thailand, Laos, Greece, Italy, Chile, Vietnam, Cambodia, France, Malaysia, Korea, China and the list goes on. Some were refugees like me. Although we were from all over the world, we all shared something in common, we all called Australia home. These children all had their own stories to tell. Stories about where their families came from, what they did and how they came to be here in Australia. And I was always fascinated and interested in learning more about them, and I'm proud to still be close friends with some of these people today.

Moving on to my days at university, I had the privilege of working closely with the Department of Multicultural Affairs and representatives of other ethnic communities in Adelaide. We worked together on events such as the Australia Day Parade in Adelaide as well as the Oz Asia Festival which is held at Elder Park each year. This gave me an opportunity to learn a lot more about these different ethnic communities and more importantly how these communities come together to contribute towards a common goal.

Fast forward a few years into the present, and I find myself here...standing before you all. I have been living in the south east now for about 5 years. There's something special about life in the country, and I don't really know how to describe it. It's the tight knit community, the long and dusty roads, it's the men and women who live off the land and the sea like their forefathers before them, it's having a beer at the local pub after work with mates, it's about looking after one another, and it's about getting together as a community to celebrate a special day.

I've been very lucky to have had such wonderful experiences in my life and to have had met so many wonderful people. To me being Australian extends far beyond where we come from or what our background is. To me being Australian is a way of life; it is an attitude towards life, it is a culture of many cultures. This is what makes us unique and this is what makes us beautiful and I wouldn't have it any other way.

I mentioned earlier, that to me, Australia Day is a day of reflection with family. Today, is no different...This is my reflection, and you are my family. I have been very touched by how the Robe Community has opened its arms and accepted this humble refugee into your family. And I hope to be of greater service you all in the years to come.

Thank you once again for your time, and Happy Australia Day!!!

## COUNCIL NEWS

### Development – Do I Need Approval?

The following information is provided to assist the community in understanding what development is and what forms of development require Development Approval. If you undertake “development” you may require Development Approval. Some examples of development are:

- ▶ Building or extending a house
- ▶ Shed or garage
- ▶ Verandah
- ▶ Carport
- ▶ Demolition
- ▶ Retaining wall
- ▶ Fence over 2 metres in height in a Residential Zone
- ▶ Signs
- ▶ Swimming pools
- ▶ Change of use of land
- ▶ The division of an allotment
- ▶ In relation to a State Heritage place – the demolition, removal, conversion, painting of, alteration of, alteration or any other work that could materially affect the heritage value of the place
- ▶ In relation to a local heritage place – the demolition, removal, conversion, alteration of, or addition to, or any other work that could materially affect the heritage value of the place
- ▶ Prescribed mining operations on land

Undertaking development may require a Development Application depending on the type, scale and location of the development. Most building work requires development assessment and approval. However, there are some forms of development which are “exempt development” and are subject to conditions including their location, size and height. You should check with Council if your proposal is an exempt development or requires Development Approval before proceeding.

If development requires Development Approval, it is illegal to undertake the development without first obtaining Development Approval. If you do not obtain Development Approval when it is needed you may face prosecution or be fined. For further information please contact the Council office on 87682003.

### What is the Emergency Medical Information Book

The 'Emergency Medical Information Book' contains all your information and medical records which are needed if or when an ambulance is called, and you need to be transported to a hospital.

When paramedics are called, a typical scenario is that distraught family members may be unable to give correct details of the patient's condition, or the medication they may be on. The paramedics physically have to collect all the patients medication in the house, try and obtain a medical history and take it to the hospital with the patient. This small book contains patient contacts, service or carer provider information, medications and any medical condition, so a paramedic is able to treat and ready a patient for transport to a hospital.

#### Who should have one of these books?

All people, adults and children who 'take medications or have a medical condition' should have a book, especially elderly people living on their own.

Each book has a clear plastic sleeve with strip magnets and is placed on the fridge door once it has been filled out by the owner (patient) together with their doctor.
