
A message from the Mayor


Chief Executive Officer's Report

Wave Data Now Live!


Following on from the Robe's Coastal Monitoring Equipment article in the January 2023 Robe Community Newsletter, I am pleased to advise that we can now all access the live data from our two wave buoys on the SA Waves Website www.sawaves.org.

In summary the live data provides the following:

- Significant wave height in metres
- Sea surface temperature
- Peak wave period in seconds and direction (the direction is based on the compass with North at the top of the graph)

Council has made the data publicly available as it can assist with:

- planning for fishing
- planning for surfing
- analysis and research (data can be exported)
- schools for educational purposes
- and so much more!

You will see on the graphs that the offshore waves were from the south west while the waves in the bay were from the west. The sea surface temperature was approximately the same offshore as onshore.

There are five locations, each with their own graph on the SA Waves Website. They are:

- Semaphore and Brighton near Adelaide
- Kangaroo Island
- The two Robe sites

It is interesting looking at our data compared to the three other buoys, particularly the water temperature. The average sea surface temperature at Semaphore was 22.06 degrees while at the same time the onshore Robe was 16.08 degrees.

No Camping

The By-Law is defined as: A person must not without the permission of the Council, do any of the following on Local Government Land including Beaches, Parks, Reserves, Car parks:

Erect a tent or other structure of calico, canvas, plastic or similar material, (including swags) Camp or sleep overnight: (unless in a caravan park)

Director of Infrastructure Report

Proposed New Navigation Beacon at Hooper Beach

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) is proposing to install a new navigation beacon at Hooper Beach off Seafarers Crescent in Robe to replace an existing navigation beacon located in the adjacent Sea Vu caravan park. The existing beacon is critical for the safe navigation into Robe at night and guides mariners away from rocks and reefs in Guichen Bay.

The existing beacon is over 50 years old and needs to be replaced as it has reached the end of its design life. The existing beacon is located between caravan park cabins making it difficult for DIT to service the beacon with a boom lift and also affects access and manoeuvrability for caravan park users.

The new beacon needs to be installed in the vicinity of the existing beacon to ensure it is seen by mariners, however with advances in lighting technology, the new beacon structure can be significantly smaller.

DIT is proposing to install the new beacon outside the caravan park area on Hooper Beach (refer to map above) between the high water mark and the bottom of the sand dunes. The new structure will consist of a steel pile covered with a black plastic sleeve, a platform and a light. The structure will be approximately five metres high above beach level. This location has been selected as the new structure will be hidden by the dunes and will not be seen from most residences. The light that flashes at night is blacked out on the land side and will not be seen from the adjacent residences.

DIT is seeking feedback from local residents and the community about this proposal. All queries, comments and feedback should be emailed to <u>dit.marineassets@sa.gov.au</u> by 1 March 2023.

You can now make ALL your booking needs (for both a Marina and/or Boat Ramp) ONLINE.





ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.
