

Mayor's Report

Petitions

There is a major increase in the use of online petitions. They cover a vast array of subjects and include global matters, National and State issues and more recently, items within our local Council area.

While it is the right of any citizen to start and promote a petition, it is important that the wording and content is accurate and correct. Misleading and emotive content that may seem advantageous for gaining support and signatures can warrant the petition to be of less importance or irrelevant when being considered. A well worded petition can be a powerful and useful tool and can provide relevant community feeling on important matters to the decision makers.

I urge those making the effort to be factual and word petitions carefully to ensure they are respected and taken seriously.

Scrap Metal

With the current world commodity prices being low for many minerals, scrap metal prices are very low. Local dealers ceased receiving scrap metal. As a result, the transfer station now has a rapidly building stockpile.

Council has identified a piece of land to provide storage for scrap metal until there is a price recovery and thus no disposal cost to the ratepayers.

International Women's Day Breakfast

Kingston Robe Women's Health Advisory Group (WHAG) hosted the international Women's Day Breakfast at Pizza Project.

Louise Stock, Rural Woman's Network Award winner was the morning's guest speaker. Louise shared with the crowd snippets of a life journey inter spread with key messages relating to International Women's Day and women's health, with a pertinent focus on domestic violence and violence towards women.

CCOWS Report

I have to confess, that once when my children were young, I said "If you do that again, I'll hit the roof". My daughter (about 3 years at the time), looked at the roof, then at me in disbelief. At the time we lived in an old Australian home with 11 foot high ceilings. Sometimes our responses to incidents are not appropriate and our words are not understood.

We know children are 'sponges', they take notice of body language and words. When you hear a little three-year old say "Absolutely!", you know they have been listening to others, and they choose to say it at the relevant time, isn't it amazing.

At CCOWS we will be talking about 'feelings'. What makes us happy? What makes us sad? How do we know when others are happy or sad? And we will be encouraging social language that will show respect for others and their feelings, like "excuse me", "thank you", "please", "sorry", "that's great", and "your turn" (I'm sure that will develop after a much-used "it's my turn").

Self-regulation of feelings and appropriate responses to situations are difficult challenges for two and three year olds. CCOWS will encourage children to talk about feelings, to help them make sense of their behaviour.

Chief Executive's Report

Closure of Robe Jetty

In accordance with the lease Council has with the Department of Planning Transport and Infrastructure for the Robe jetty, Council is required to have a Jetty condition report prepared for both the above water and below water sections of the Jetty. Copies of these reports are available on Councils website.

Council received and considered the below water report at its March meeting and acting upon the engineering advice provided have resolved to temporarily close the jetty to public access. While the jetty is closed, Council will be working with the Department to ascertain the costs involved in repairing the jetty versus the costs involved in removing the jetty and who will bare these costs.

Council hope to be able to provide the public with further information in the May Newsletter.

Council regret having to make this decision however the safety of the public is Councils paramount responsibility.

Draft Beach Access Strategy

The level of community response to Councils call for comment of the Draft Beach Access Strategy is pleasing and demonstrates the importance the community place on the coastal dunes and beaches within Robe. While the consultation period closed on the 18th of March, Council will still benefit from any comments received in a reasonable time after the closing date.

The community responses will be collated and presented to Council for consideration at the April Council meeting together with a report that recommends how the strategy should be changed in response to the feedback received.

While Council have not formally made a decision, it is anticipated that a further round of consultation and community engagement will be undertaken to obtain feedback in relation to the amended Strategy.

Sea-Vu Caravan Park – rent review

It is not usual for Council to make public comment in relation to negotiations that relate to commercial properties owned by Council.

The matter of the rent review of the Sea- Vu Caravan Park has been made public via social media and therefore while it is important to keep these negotiations confidential, it is also very important for Council to present the facts in relation to this matter.

- Council own the Sea-Vu Caravan Park and have a long term lease in relation to its operation. Any changes to this lease are undertaken by negotiation between Council (landlord) and the lessees (tenants).
- The land that comprises the Sea-Vu Caravan Park is a combination of private property, unmade road reserve and Coastal Reserve Crown Land under the care and control of Council.
- In 2012/13 portion of the cliff within the caravan park collapsed. The land upon which the cliff failure occurred is Crown Land- Coastal Reserve under the care and control of Council and this portion of the park is used for unpowered sites and boat parking.
- In 2013 the site was inspected by Council staff together with staff and Board members of the Coast Protection Board.
- The advice received from the Coast Protection Board is that the Board acknowledges that cliff collapse will continue and therefore supports the restriction of access to the cliff top as a precautionary approach.
- In accordance with the terms of the Caravan Park Lease, Council and the Lessees are required to undertake a rent review in 2016.

As this rent review will be undertaken this year, Council formed the view that the time was opportune to;

- Close the unmade road reserve and amalgamate the unmade road reserve into the title for the Caravan Park. This will remove the need for Council to issue a license to lease the unmade road reserve to the lessees of the park. It will also ensure that the security of park patrons is protected as currently, even though the Caravan Park lease the road reserve, public access to the road reserve cannot be prevented.
- Reduce the amount of Crown Land within the lease to allow a 5 metre set back from the cliff edge. This strip of land would revert back to Councils care and control. The management of any future cliff collapse will be easier if the land it is not subject to a lease and is only used for passive recreation. While the strip of land is managed by Council it will be easier to monitor the safety of the cliff edge.
- As Council are undertaking a rent review there is the opportunity to adjust the rent payable in relation to the lease to reflect any changes to the status of the land.

Council will not be commenting further on this matter as it believes that the negotiation of any alterations to the commercial lease are between Council and the lessees and not decided upon through social media.

Major development – Nora Creina Golf Course

Council has made a submission to the Department of Planning Transport and Infrastructure providing qualified support for the proposed Nora Creina Golf Course and Tourism development. Council qualified support means that the development must satisfy the State Governments requirements in relation to protection of the environment and aboriginal heritage and if these requirements are met, Council believes that the development will have significant economic impacts upon the township of Robe and the Limestone Coast region.

Public Art – Willem Koenig figurehead

The Willem Koenig figure head representation has been erected at a suitable location on the coastal walking trail overlooking the area where the vessel sank. Council believes that this location is appropriate for the piece of public art.



UPDATE YOUR INFORMATION REGULARLY AND KEEP YOUR BOOK ON THE FRIDGE

What is the Emergency Medical Information Book

The 'Emergency Medical Information Book' contains all your information and medical records which are needed if or when an ambulance is called, and you need to be transported to a hospital.

When paramedics are called, a typical scenario is that distraught family members may be unable to give correct details of the patient's condition, or the medication they may be on. The paramedics physically have to collect all the patients medication in the house, try and obtain a medical history and take it to the hospital with the patient. This small book contains patient contacts, service or carer provider information, medications and any medical condition, so a paramedic is able to treat and ready a patient for transport to a hospital.

Who should have one of these books?

All people, adults and children who 'take medications or have a medical condition' should have a book, especially elderly people living on their own.

Each book has a clear plastic sleeve with strip magnets and is placed on the fridge door once it has been filled out by the owner (patient) together with their doctor.

Celebrating a century of service

Lions donate \$100,000 for 100 projects

To mark Lions Club International's centennial, the Lions Club of Robe has signed on to help Lions Australia give away more than \$100,000 to over 100 local projects as part of its Community 100 program. The \$100,000 will be available in the form of \$1000 grants to projects which make a difference to the community in fields of youth, vision, hunger or the environment.

The Lions Club of Robe is one of more than 100 of Australia's clubs chosen to form 'Team 100', which will help to roll out the grant opportunity locally.

Local organisations, initiatives and projects in the Limestone Coast region and the surrounding areas are encouraged to make the most of the \$1000 grant opportunity offered by the Lions Club of Robe. Lions Australia Executive Officer Rob Oerlemans said the Community 100 program provides local clubs with the opportunity to reach out to communities and create new partnerships.

"If you can think of a community need, the chances are there's a Lions Club doing something about it," Mr Oerlemans said.

"For almost 100 years Lions have shared a core belief that community is what we make it and the Lions Australia Community 100 program celebrates this belief.

The program brings together our clubs in a campaign designed to drive awareness, while also helping funding new projects in the communities we serve."

Lions Australia, which will celebrate 70 years of service in 2017, was first established in 1947 and is currently Lions Club International's 18th oldest club in operation. Each year the local clubs of Lions Australia raise between \$25-30 million for community initiatives, projects and causes.
