# **Public Consultation – By-law Review**

Pursuant to section 249 of the Local Government Act 1999, notice is hereby given that at its meeting on 12 April 2023, the Council endorsed the proposed By-laws listed herein for public consultation. Public Consultation officially commences on 9 May 2023 and concludes at 5pm on Monday 5 June 2023. Details regarding the nature and effect of the proposed By-laws are as follows:

# By-law No. 1 – Permits and Penalties:

A By-law to create a permit system for Council By-laws, to fix maximum and continuing penalties for offences, and to clarify the construction of Council By-laws.

By-law No. 2 – Local Government Land by-law:

This By-law is to manage and regulate the access to and use of Local Government land (other than roads), and certain public places.

# By-law No. 3 – Roads:

This By-law is for the management, control and regulation of certain activities on roads in the Council's area.

# By-law No. 4 - Moveable signs:

This By-law is to set standards for moveable signs on roads and to provide conditions for the placement of such

signs for the purpose of protecting visual amenity and public safety in the Council's area.

# By-law No. 5 - Dogs:

A By-law to limit the number of dogs kept on premises and for the management and control of dogs in the Council's area.

# By-law No. 6 - Cats:

A By-law to limit the number of cats kept on premises and for the management and control of cats in the Council area.

Members of the public are invited to provide written comment to the Council in respect of the proposed Bylaws. All written comments must be provided to the Council before 5pm on Monday 5 June 2023.

# Four Year Business Plan 2023/24 to 2026/27 and Annual Budget 2023/24

Councillors are currently business planning for the upcoming financial year and are meeting frequently to discuss important matters for our community. We encourage you to come along to public meetings and take a seat in the gallery to witness the discussions firsthand.

Once the draft document has been endorsed for public consultation, the community will be notified via facebook, website and the Community Newsletter. Council have scheduled a public meeting for Thursday 1 June 2023 to provide the community with the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback on the business plan

Agendas and Minutes for Council meetings are publicly available on the Council Website and it is a great way for you to see what Councillors are provided with when they head to the Chamber to make decisions, and find out the outcomes.

# **Vegetation Clearing**

Council recently approved a proposal for the roadside trimming of trees, shrubs and vegetation as required to maintain roadside clearance and to specifically target the removal of individual mature plants of listed weed species surrounding the Drain L Lakes system.

Council is required like any land manager to prevent the spread of listed weeds.

The works are scheduled to occur in winter and further works to manage germination of seedlings will be undertaken in Spring and Summer.

# **End of Fire Danger Season**

Fire Danger Season officially concludes at midnight on Sunday 30 April 2023.

The introduction of the Environment Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 resulted in a number of changes to controls relating to burning in the open. One of the major changes that was introduced is the requirement to obtain a permit when burning within the township regardless of the time of year.

The District Council of Robe has developed a Township Burning Permit Policy to establish a set of criteria to be considered by Council's delegated officers when assessing permit applications for burning within the Robe township. A Burning Permit is required to carry out one or more of the following burning activities outside of a fire danger season:

- Burning agriculture or forestry waste; or
- Burning off vegetation for fire prevention or control; or
- Burning vegetation for any other purpose.

In assessing burning permit applications, Council's Authorised Officers are required to consider the following criteria:

• Bushfire risk of the area

- Purpose of the proposed burning
- Amount of material to be burnt
- Fuel load present on adjoining properties
- Properties in proximity or adjoining reserves or national parks
- Proximity and potential impact to neighbouring residents

- Availability of other reasonable means to dispose of the vegetation
- Legitimacy of the proposed burning i.e. is this genuine fire hazard reduction or rubbish removal
- Nature of material to be burnt
- Size of the Allotment
- Terrain of the allotment and locality
- Accessibility to the allotment and area where the vegetation is to be burnt
- Is the material declared and or woody weeds
- Is the material diseased plant material
- Requirements of the Country Fire Service Broad Acre Burning Code of Practice
- Requirements of the Country Fire Service Vegetation Pile Burning Code of Practice
- Religious or Cultural purposes

The Application for Permit for Burning in the Open will be required to be completed and sent to the Council office to enable a Council Authorised Officer to assess an application for burning in the open. The Council Authorised Officer will then determine if a Burning Permit will be issued and any conditions that will apply.

### **Robe Institute Kitchen Repairs**

In efforts to maintain the Robe Institute facility, it's wonderful to see the Institute kitchen roof recently replaced.

Earlier this year, the Robe Institute had a Fabric Condition Report conducted with recommendations provided. This report highlighted the water damage to the ceiling in the kitchen (which was repaired late last year), and also recommended that the roof be inspected and repaired/replaced as necessary, as a matter of urgency.

Inspections were conducted, and a full replacement of this section of roof was required due to its condition.

Upon conducting the repairs, other issues were identified (such as rotten timbers) which were able to be repaired at the same time, proving the work to be very timely.

# Will you answer the call? Join the Robe Volunteer Ambulance Team today.

SA Ambulance Service has launched its recruitment campaign Answer the Call and is looking for more volunteers in your region.

More than 1200 volunteers provide ambulance services in 80 locations across the state, including at Robe.

The Robe volunteer team responds to the community for chest pain, breathing problems or pre-existing medical conditions, and on occasion, trauma cases.

Regional Team Leader Taylor Martin said volunteers trained together regularly so they were always ready to answer the call.

"Our volunteers nominate when they are on shift at a time when it suits them," Taylor said.

"We've got a great group at Robe, and we're looking forward to meeting new recruits who want to give it a go," she said.

Volunteers gain experience and nationally □recognized qualifications in pre-hospital care, meet new people and support their communities.

New recruits do a combination of online and face-to-face training, and are always paired with a qualified officer while on a call.

"SAAS provides training, uniform and reimburses out of pocket costs such as travel and childcare," Taylor said.

"Some of our people have gone onto careers in health, in a variety of positions, after receiving an insight into the sector through volunteering for SAAS," she said.

A fully qualified volunteer Ambulance Officer is awarded a Certificate IV in Healthcare once their training is complete.

Volunteers and their families also receive free Ambulance Cover whilst volunteering for their communities with SAAS.

We encourage all residents and ratepayers to download the App. It is very easy to use, and the details are specific to your house location. MyLocal Services App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

# **ENOTICES**

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to council@robe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.
