COUNCIL TO SET SAIL ON FRESH STRATEGIC JOURNEY

The District Council of Robe has coincided the commencement of their new Chief Executive Officer and a new year, with a decision to embark on a fresh strategic direction early in 2024.

The Council will utilise existing budget originally earmarked for a Robe 2050 Plan to develop a shorter strategic plan, with realistic and measurable outcomes that will be developed in collaboration with the community.

Mayor Lisa Ruffell stated that the Council is keen to build on the 'Robe Community Voices', being the findings from the 2050 Community Survey undertaken in mid-2022. "We are very appreciative of the time taken by nearly 400 survey participants and will use their responses as the first stage of engagement for our new strategic plan", she said.

"The Robe 2050 Plan is something to aspire to, but right now our immediate focus is on current issues, planning for the future and achieving outcomes in the current term of Council".

Chief Executive Officer Nat Traeger, who commenced with the Council on 2 January 2024 is excited to be managing the project, "it will give me an opportunity to work with the Council and community to set our strategic path together right from the start".

"It is important to put our future in the hands of the community and we will ensure there is a rigorous community engagement strategy in place, with many ways to get involved and provide input", she said.

In resolving to develop a new strategic plan, the Council also endorsed the findings from the 2050 community survey, which has given the Council a head-start and heads-up.

Some of the key areas that residents would like to see addressed are more vegetation, walking/biking tracks, more community gathering spaces and events, better traffic flow, reduced traffic congestion and affordable housing for families, workers and retirees wishing to downsize.

In closing Mayor Ruffell said, "there is strong evidence to support Robe retaining its unique characteristics, which include the rugged natural coastline, the vast natural ocean and beach views, our boutique retail ambiance, high quality cafes and restaurants, old stone buildings, the quaintness, and village feel".

Both the Mayor and Chief Executive Officer are committed to respecting this feedback, as well as any other sentiments derived through developing the new strategic plan.

Work on the new strategic plan will commence immediately and the community will be kept informed throughout the process.

Dear Community Members

It is my privilege to be appointed as the Chief Executive Officer of the District Council of Robe. As I settle into the role, it is evident that Robe is an exciting place to be, with so many community groups, businesses and individuals keen to share their projects and aspirations in my first few weeks of service.

Other than getting to know my new team members, collectively and individually, my initial focus has been on re-setting our strategic direction, noting that the intention of this is detailed in a media release above in this newsletter.



I am aware of long-standing issues with community groups and have moved quickly to meet with the Bowling Club as well as facilitating the new Robe Golf Club Community Reference Group, which has equal membership of golf club and council representatives; together we will work through lease and land related matters at the Robe Golf Club.

Most recently I have met with the Robe Surf Lifesaving Club about their plans for a more established facility, which will include storage and meeting space, with capacity for kiosk and a licenced area.

This kind of community projects, our own infrastructure projects and service initiatives already identified, plus new ideas that are brought to Council's attention through the upcoming Strategic Plan 2024-2024 community engagement campaign, will be combined with the findings of the Robe 2050 Community Voices report, which is now publicly available on our website.

I am passionate about robust and transparent community engagement and to that end, you can expect to see more defined engagement strategies, such as the one we have commenced for the Robe Street Redevelopment Project. We have a new major projects section on our website where we are committed to having current information and updates about the projects we are delivering for our community.

To those of you I have met, thank you for the warm welcome; I look forward to integrating with the community as time permits. Mayor, Elected Members & CEO Message

A summary of the outcomes from the January Ordinary Council Meeting is shown below:

- •The Building Fire Safety Committee Terms of Reference and Committee Members were adopted. The Committee is the appropriate authority responsible for investigating whether commercial building overs are maintaining a proper level of building fire safety for the protection of all occupants of their buildings.
- ·Council resolved to reallocate this years funding from the Robe 2050 Plan to the review and development of a new Strategic Plan. The survey data from the Robe 2050 Plan will be incorporated into the Strategic plan.
- It was also resolved to switch back to an Annual Business Plan & Budget from 2024/25 onwards.
- •The Robe Golf Club Community Reference Group was established, with Terms of Reference and Members added to the Group. The Reference Group will assist Council to provide clear, accountable and transparent communication between the Council and the Robe Golf Club and engage with key stakeholders from the Robe Golf Club. The Group will also aid in informal and mutually proactive discussions about lease and land related matters.
- ·The Terms of Reference for the CEO Performance Review Committee were reviewed and adopted by Council.
- ·A timeline for the 2024/25 Business Plan & Budget preparation was adopted which will help guide staff through the process and hold Council accountable to the deadlines.
- ·Council considered the 2023 quarterly Community Forums and resolved having regard to the schedule of community engagement already foreshadowed in the first six (6) months of 2024, to provide delegated approval to the Chief Executive Officer to schedule a general community forum in the second half of 2024.
- An exemption on the Local Government Land By-Law's was endorsed by Council to grants an exemption to all vulnerable persons from compliance with clause 10.13.4 of the By-Law at all times when the By-Law is in force. - ·Council considered five Community Assistance Fund applications and resolved to provide three groups with \$2,000.
- ·A fee waiver for hard stand boat storage was considered and endorsed by Council.

A special thank you to all who came out to enjoy the ceremony, and an extra special thank you to the National Australia Day Council for the grant funding which funded a free breakfast, lunch and entertainment by AXIS.

We also had the privilege of hearing a speech from Andrew Dening, third generation professional fisherman and President of the Robe Professional Fisherman's Association, on what it means to him to be a Robe local and to live in this vibrant community. A transcript of his speech is on the following page.









Andrew Dening - Australia Day speech

"Good morning, my name is Andrew Dening.

I am a third generation professional fisherman and the President of the Robe Professional Fisherman's Association. I want to thank Mayor Ruffell for the invitation to speak to you all today.

I have lived my whole life in this beautiful town, and throughout my career as a professional fisherman, I have fished for crayfish, shark,



snapper and giant king crabs. The Dening family moved to the Robe area well over 100 years ago – my paternal grandfather Jack was a builder by trade and ventured into crayfishing in 1938 while living just down the road at Boatswains Point. Jack and his wife Irene had eight children together – Roy, Marion, Jackie, Pud, Bruce, Jerry, Lorraine, and Lyle. All six boys followed in their father's footsteps to become crayfisherman, and both girls married crayfisherman – Bones Fennell and Darcy Elliot. My father, Pud Dening, first went fishing with Grandpa Jack when he was 15 years old, and when Robe township decided to dredge the channel into Lake Butler in 1964, Pud and his wife Pearl moved to Robe. Pud started crayfishing on his own aboard the 'Seaspray', and towards the end of his career, he fished for both crayfish and shark aboard the 'Bronzewing'. As a 12 year old kid, I can remember going out with Pud on the 'Bronzewing' sharking for 5-6 days at sea during the school holidays. At age 17, I went fishing fulltime with Pud as his deckhand on the 'Bronzewing'.

In 1990, I purchased the crayfish and shark licenses from Pud. That same year, I built the 'Nihilator' – the boat that I would have until 2021. Pud fished with me for two more years while I continued learning from him and building confidence to skipper on my own.

Of those 11 years aboard the Bronzewing with Pud, I can still remember some of the rough weather and huge seas we went fishing in – 30-40 knot winds, swells of 4-5 meters. Weather forecasts were not as accurate as they are today, and pre-quota, it was a "fish as many days as possible during the season to make a dollar" industry. With Pud, not once did I ever think I wouldn't make it home safely – he was and always will be the most experienced and best skipper I've ever known, and I'm proud that he was my father.

Various deckies have fished with me over the years, and some have gone on to buy their own lobster licenses and vessels. Since 2016, my son Brodie has been fishing with me, and in 2021, my family built the 'Raging Bull' to replace the 'Nihilator'. Like most owner/operators in the crayfishing industry, we hope that the business stays in our family for generations to come. It is likely that when I decide to retire within the next few years, Brodie will take over, as I did from my own father.

Andrew Dening - Australia Day speech (continued)

Whilst fishing has traditionally been a male-dominated industry, I hope that someday soon, someone's daughter might seize the opportunity and choose to not only go fishing, which some women have done over the years, but eventually skipper her own vessel here in Robe. The last four years have been extremely challenging for the local lobster industry, with low prices and trade restrictions imposed by China, our biggest export market. We hope that these restrictions will soon be lifted, and it will be back to business as usual.

Growing up in Robe as a child, the town was a lot smaller than it is today – it was localized to the current town centre, Long Beach was undeveloped land. We would all walk or ride our pushbikes to school, and we were able to leave school at lunchtime to go to Hateley's Bakery, Giffards Deli or Sneaths fish and chip shop without needing permission, to buy our lunch. Outside of school we had the freedom to roam, whether it be fishing down the wharf, swimming at front beach or setting rabbit traps around the obelisk and old jetty in the scrub. I remember when it was possible to drive your car entirely around the obelisk, and now we all ask ourselves, "when will she fall?".

Many will remember the kiosk at the foreshore, run by Faye Slaughter when I was a kid, and in its final years Jan Bermingham where we could all run up the ramp to buy hot food, soft drink, and icecream after swimming out to "Big Bobba", the pontoon at Front Beach. During summer school holidays, every Saturday night movies were shown right here at the Institute, which we all went to. In winter, playing football and netball was our biggest weekend activity – much the same as it is these days.

For me personally, what I love about Robe – I love the intersection of fishing and farming, the rural lifestyle that we are able to lead. The community is great and Robe is an incredibly safe place to raise a family. I love that I still don't need to lock my car and I can safely leave my dog in the back of the ute when popping into shops. Ask a favour and the people of Robe come to the fore, and you always run into friends down the street.

Robe has always been a popular tourist destination and I love seeing the town come alive every summer. We have two of the safest and most popular beaches in SA – Front Beach and Long Beach – one of the last remaining beaches in SA that you can still drive your car on. The natural beauty of Robe remains the same as I remember it from my childhood. By growing up in Robe, you really do appreciate all that this beautiful little town has to offer.

Robe Street Redevelopment

The District Council of Robe aims to work with community to improve the safety for road users and increase the efficiency of our road network. Robe Street is currently a key connection between industrial, residential and tourism precincts in the township of Robe. New residential development, industrial usage and local produce providers have enticed community, and tourism foot and vehicle traffic which is impacting Council's asset and infrastructure.

Community feedback to Council has identified the drop in service level of Robe Street, its condition and lack of safe walkways for visitors and community.

While action on road safety is the responsibility of all spheres of government, councils have a particular role to play as road managers, employers, and leaders in the community. As road managers, councils build, maintain, and regulate roads and have a responsibility to provide a safe operating environment for road users.

Key outcomes for the Robe Street Redevelopment Project include;

- Increased parking in the area-Total of 97 Extra parks
- Footpath access from Brouwer Estate to existing path
- Cross over Points for pedestrians and school bus run
- Clear delineation for Jenny Matthews Carpark
- Reserve seating areas
- Widening of Bitumen to match existing and ensure clearance for heavy vehicles

This project has been endorsed by Council through its inclusion in the 2023-24 Annual Business Plan and budget.

Council ran an engagement session on January 31 2024 with business owners/ occupiers to gather vital feedback for the Major Project, with key findings being incorporated to the draft concept plans. Community Assistance Fund

Council has a Community Assistance Fund grant program and allocated \$10,000 in the 2023/24 financial year.

In accordance with the Community Assistance Policy, applications for the grant were open to the community from 1 November 2023 to 18 December 2023. Council received several submissions for funding.



Council considered the five applications at their January 2024 meeting and gave approval to provide \$2,000 grants each to three of these submissions. The successful applicants were:

- Robe Sports and Recreation Association (RSRA)
- Robe Netball Club, and
- SA Rural Women's Gathering Robe Committee (Rural Women's Gathering).

The RSRA funding is a contribution towards the cost of security at the Robe Sports Complex over the New Year period, while the Netball Club funding is a contribution towards their lighting upgrade. The Rural Women's Gathering are using the money to assist with the cost of holding the event in Robe.

Unfortunately, the other two applicants were unsuccessful as they were not eligible in accordance with our Policy.

The Community Assistance Fund will be open again for applications in the new financial year. Keep an eye out in the Robe Community Newsletter for when it is open!





Community Wastewater Management Scheme - Desludging of septic tanks

As part of the operating and maintenance of Council's Community Wastewater Management System (CWMS), Council provides a septic tank desludging program to properties within the Robe township that are connected to the CWMS.


To prevent sludge passing into council's drains, our contractor Envirogen Industrial Services attend each property on a four year cycle to remove accumulated sludge from the tanks. This work is done as an ongoing maintenance program, not as an emergancy call out for plumbing blockages.

The next sector to be desludged is **Sector 4** (see below). Letters have been sent to ratepayers who will be effected. Later in the year, Envirogen Industrial Services will notify rate payers as to when they are required to expose the septic tank. If you fail to expose the tank lid, there will be additional charges.

If you thinking of building, landscaping, paving or constructing a driveway it is critical to find out where your tank is and include this in your plan as adequate access to the lid of the tank (not the inspection point) is a must for maintenance and pumping. Construction on or near your septic system could damage the tank, pipes or soil.

Properties that are not connected to the CWMS, which dispose of their effluent to an on-site soakage drain still need to be desludged routinely at the owners expense.

Crime Stoppers - Focus on Farm Crime

Crime Stoppers South Australia has provided Council with the below signage, for collection by Robe's rural property owners to enhance security on their farm and land.

These are free of charge, and can be collected from the Council Office.

"Our campaign helps regional and rural communities address the growing threat of criminals that target isolated and vulnerable farming properties across South Australia. We want to help empower rural property owners and businesses to safeguard their livestock, tools, machinery, water and fuel from potential thieves.

Trespassing, illegal shooting, hunting, burglary, and theft are prevalent challenges for those residing on regional properties. That's why we are collaborating with police and local communities to create a resilient defense against opportunistic thieves.

WHY REPORTING MATTERS

Reporting incidents of rural crime is crucial as it provides police with valuable insights into the true extent of farm crime and specific locations targeted by thieves. Rural properties are often attractive targets due to their isolation and fewer witnesses, making it essential for landowners to be vigilant and proactive in protecting their properties as best as possible.

Patterns of offending indicate a high level of planning and organisation by a small group of repeat offenders, who are responsible for significant losses in terms of livestock and farm equipment. By reporting crimes and suspicious activities, a more accurate understanding of targeted areas and the types of property stolen can be developed.

According to the Australian Institute of Criminology, crime in rural areas is on the rise. Areas close to regional or urban centers commonly experience theft of farm machinery, vehicles, or tools, while very remote areas face the highest levels of livestock theft, illegal hunting, fishing, theft of materials and illegal dumping of waste.

If you have been a victim of a crime you should make a report direct to police. For police attendance, call 131 444 and for a life-threatening emergency, call 000.

If you have information about an unsolved crime or suspicious activity (that does not require a police response) you can anonymously contact Crime Stoppers from our homepage or freecall 1800 333 000."










Drooping Sheoak (Allocasuarina verticillata).

The drooping sheoak is a native tree recognized for its unique, evergreen, needle-like foliage that forms a drooping canopy. This hardy tree, generally reaching 5-10 metres in height, is adaptable to a wide range of soil types. It has distinct woody cones and seasonal reddish-brown flowers. Requires planting during the autumn months and can be used as a windbreak. The initial years require consistent watering. The sheoak can be planted in either full sun or partial shade.





Brown Stringybark (Eucalyptus baxteri).

A medium-sized tree that is native to the southeastern Australia. It has rough, stringy bark and a height of 40 metres. It is recommended that it be the endangered south-eastern red-tailed cockatoo.



The Free Presbyterian Chaple - Sturt St - The Wee Free, The Kirk, Scots Kirk



The Free Presbyterian Chapel stands besides St Peter's Anglican Church, it is one of the most important early building so the town. The Kirk is the second church build in the district. Built in 1858 for the Presbyterians it has been widely used by all Protestant denominations. Besides a place of worship, it was also well utilised as a meeting place by many other groups including Robe Temperance Society (1862) and the Mechanics Institute (1862-68). During this time, it was a venue for many lectures and social events as well as housing a library including British newspapers and books. A Museum was opened in the building in 1865 and a school in 1869, and in more recent times it was used as a Sunday school.

The building fell into disrepair as the town's prosperity declined. In 1984 a group of enthusiastic locals gained permission (but not financial assistance) from the Anglican Church to restore the building. As a result of community support and fundraising the building as brought back to life.

The Kirk is State Heritage listed

The large Huon pine table – the statement piece of the building – was originally housed in the Mechanical Institute Library.


