

Spotlight on February Council Decisions

'Golf Club Swings into Action'

- Teeing-off strongly, the recently formed Robe Golf Club Community Reference Group has met a couple of times in quick succession.
- A little birdie tells me they are chipping away at unresolved land matters, acknowledging there is a fairway to go to assist them in staying putt on a permanent basis.
- It's good times as par as the eye can see, with Council reaffirming their intention to subdivide Lot 1 Backler Street on the basis that the conservation zone forms one portion and the land currently occupied as a golf course forms the other.
- Council will also commence proceedings to close the unmade road reserve to the west of the Robe Cemetery land and incorporate it into Lot 1 Waterhouse Hundred which will tee up some loose ends and make managing the land a hole new ball game!

'The Marina Matters'

- Following a report on the Safework SA Hardstand, Council has agreed to not use that area for car parking in the future.
- Council achieved resolution for Limestone Coast Boat Tours to utilise their berth for commercial purposes, thereby allowing use for both commercial fishing and commercial purposes.
- Iconic boats will no longer be provided a discount for mooring in the Marina.
- A 10% discount on shallow berths in the butler arm was approved for BT9, 11, 13, 8, 10 and 12 while they remain in their current shallow state.

Robe Street Redevelopment

The District Council of Robe aims to work with community to improve the safety for road users and increase the efficiency of our road network. Robe Street is currently a key connection between industrial, residential and tourism precincts in the township of Robe. New residential development, industrial usage and local produce providers have enticed community, and tourism foot and vehicle traffic which is impacting Council's asset and infrastructure.

Community feedback to Council has identified the drop in service level of Robe Street, its condition and lack of safe walkways for visitors and community.

While action on road safety is the responsibility of all spheres of government, councils have a particular role to play as road managers, employers, and leaders in the community. As road managers, councils build, maintain, and regulate roads and have a responsibility to provide a safe operating environment for road users.

Key outcomes for the Robe Street Redevelopment Project include;

- Increased parking in the area- Total of 97 Extra parks
- Footpath access from Brouwer Estate to existing path
- Cross over Points for pedestrians and school bus run
- Clear delineation for Jenny Matthews Carpark
- Reserve seating areas
- Widening of Bitumen to match existing and ensure clearance for heavy vehicles

This project has been endorsed by Council through its inclusion in the 2023-24 Annual Business Plan and budget.

Council ran an engagement session on January 31 2024 with business owners/ occupiers to gather vital feedback for the Major Project, with key findings being incorporated to the draft concept plans. - For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.





Native Trees For Sale FRIENDS OF LITTLE DIP **Community Nursery**





The drooping sheoak is a native tree recognized for its unique, evergreen, needle-like foliage that forms a drooping canopy. This hardy tree, generally reaching 5-10 metres in height, is adaptable to a wide range of soil types. It has distinct woody cones and seasonal reddish-brown flowers. Requires planting during the autumn months and can be used as a windbreak. The initial years require consistent watering. The sheoak can be planted in either full sun or partial shade.



Brown Stringybark (Eucalyptus baxteri).

A medium-sized tree that is native to the southeastern Australia. It has rough, stringy bark and a curved adult leaf. Beautiful green to yellow flower buds form in groups. Note: this tree can grow to a height of 40 metres. It is recommended that it be planted in a large sized garden or block during autumn. The seeds are an important source of food for



Dryland tea tree (Melaleuca lanceolata).

A South Australian native small tree which can grow to 1 - 8 metres in height. This will grow well in frontline coastal situations as well as inland regions. Required planting in alkaline soils during autumn. Flowers are white or cream in large clusters and flower during the summer months. The Dryland tea tree is a hardy plant which will grow on loam soils, brown, grey or white sand, limestone ridges, coastal cliffs and dunes.


