This month has been a busy one with two public meetings on the 1st and 19th of June where our Draft Four Year Business Plan 2023/24 to 2026/27 and Annual Budget 2023/24 was presented.

Thank you to all who attended and joined in on our live stream. Thank you for the feedback and involvement in the meetings, it is helpful to hear what community would like included in this plan. The public consultation period closed 23 June and council will now determine the submissions.

I had the pleasure of presenting the toast at the Lions Club of Robe Change Over Dinner on 14 June. It was a wonderful event where the huge achievements of the Robe Lions Club were celebrated. Lions Club members have selflessly dedicated their time, effort, and resources to improve the lives of individuals and families in need. I would like to recognise the key achievements and projects of the Lions Club of Robe for 2022/2023.

- Long Beach Lions Reserve – playground fence

- Second Chance Shop, Recycling and waste management, providing affordable clothing & accessories

Acting CEO Update

SAROC Annual Business Plan 2023/24

The District Council of Robe has received opportunity to provide feedback on the South Australian Regional Organisation of Councils (SAROC) committees Annual Business Plan. A workshop with Elected Members gathered feedback which will be submitted to the committee to assist in the review of the draft plan. The SAROC has been established as a committee of the LGA and is responsible to the LGA for the discharge of its functions. SAROC is a strong, united voice for regional councils and represents their shared interests for the benefit of regional communities.

Free Resilient Ready Program

Limestone Coast small business owners, operators and employees can learn how to take small steps to get ready for future disruptions through a FREE business resilience program now open for registrations. The Business Community Resilience (BCR) Toolkit: Limestone coast program helps small businesspeople to prepare, connect and build resilience.

From July to September participants will receive 15 micro-learning modules on resilient ready topics including removing the linchpin, creating more revenue streams, cybersecurity and connecting with the business next door. Co-designed with a local advisory group the program is open to all small businesses within the City of Mount Gambier, District Council of Grant, District Council of Robe, Kingston District Council, Naracoorte Lucindale Council, Tatiara District Council and Wattle Range Council.

Roads

A portion of old Naracoorte road rebuild has been completed and the works team have been attending to road maintenance from the wet weather over the last few weeks.

Driving in rain, fog, snow or bright sunlight can be difficult.

- Slow down. You'll have more time if something goes wrong.
- In thick fog, heavy rain and blinding sunlight, drive slowly enough to always know what's ahead.
- Don't overtake if you're not sure the road ahead is clear.
- Drive slowly if there's ice on the road. Brake gently, and don't leave it until the last moment.
- Turn on your headlights - even in light rain - to help you see and be seen.
- In cold weather, turn on your front and rear demisters to keep your windows clear.
- Leave a bigger gap than normal between you and the car in front. You need more time to stop in bad weather.
- In very bad weather, pull over and take a break.

General Business

The Restoration of 'Mother Mary' statue: Star of the Sea church by Patricia Moseley

Late in 2022 I was asked if I could restore Mother Mary, being cast in cement, this was an element I had not worked in before (re portraiture).

Because moisture had seeped into the steel armature it had rusted, thus splitting half of the head and veil; the only alternative was to restore her in plaster. A challenge for me, unknown waters so to speak.

It did mean that she could not be placed out in the open elements again - Mother Mary's special niche above the doorway of the 'Star of the Sea' built in 1858, but so far no records to date, as to when she was placed in her niche.

By the time Mother Mary arrived at my studio, the remaining left hand side of her face and veil (looking at the statue directly) had come away completely. Having sourced suitable plaster for the restoration, I began work slowly building up the missing areas in April 23. Because of having a 3/4 hour window of good light, Mother Mary slowly came to be whole again.

Because of my shoulder tolerating this regime of chiselling and carving, I could only work alternate days. When one looks up to a statue/portrait, you work beneath it for correct visual outcome.

Mother Mary being 900mm high, she is 'whole' again, completed in June 23.

We do know that she was cast in Preston, Vic, the foundry still in existence and at this stage looking forward to finding out more details.

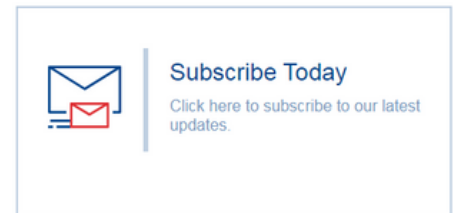

MYLOCAL SERVICES APP

My Local Services is a mobile phone app that allows you to report a problem within the Council area, receive notifications about waste collection days and check Waste Transfer Station opening times. The app is designed to make it more convenient to find Council information 24/7.

We encourage all residents and ratepayers to download the App. It is very easy to use, and the details are specific to your house location. MyLocal Services App can be downloaded from the Apple App Store and Google Play.

ENOTICES

Please note that the current rates notices contain a new feature, 'Enotice' which will make it easier for our ratepayers to manage their rates. Ratepayers will need to use the reference number, top right of your rates notice, to login and create a new account:

The benefits of Enotice are;

- It is possible to see both current and previous rates notices using this feature.
- You can choose to have your rates notice emailed directly to you rather than posted.
- To allow ratepayers to update their email addresses and add email recipients. (e.g. if more than one person has an interest in the property)
- For ratepayers who own multiple properties this feature will be of great use, as you are able to add multiple assessments to the one account, creating a more efficient way to manage all properties.

Please note that this function does not allow you to update your residential or postal address, this still needs to be sent directly to Council. This can either be emailed to council@robe.sa.gov.au or posted to PO Box 1, Robe SA 5276.
